The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for, is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

FLAXTON, ESCRICK, BISHOPTHORPE, AND YORK OUT-RELIEF UNIONS.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the York Union:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Flaxton Out-Relief Union;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Escrick Out-Relief Union;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bishopthorpe Out-Relief Union;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the York Out-Relief Union;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes and townships comprised in each of the said Out-Relief Unions;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by an Order made by the Poor Law Commissioners on the 24th day of July, 1847, relating (among other Poor Law Unions)

to the York Union, and hereinafter referred to as the "General Consolidated Order, 1847," the Guardians of that Union were required to appoint a Superintendent of Out-Door Labour;

And whereas by an Order dated the 18th day of May, 1852, and hereinafter referred to as the "York Union (Out-Door Relief Regulation) Order," the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with respect to the administration of the relief of poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas by the Yorkshire (Division of York Union, &c.) Confirmation Order, 1894, the said Union as altered by that Order, was, for certain purposes, including the purpose of out-door relief, divided into the Flaxton Out-Relief Union, the Escrick Out-Relief Union, the Bishopthorpe Out-Relief Union, and the York Out-Relief Union;

And whereas by virtue of, and in so far as is mentioned in, an Order issued by Us, the Local Government Board, and dated the 27th day of December, 1894, the General Consolidated Order, 1847, and the York Union (Out-Door Relief Regulation) Order are in force in the said Out-Relief Unions, and it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the relief of the Poor and with regard to the services of a Superintendent of Out-Door Labour in those Unions:

Now therefore, with respect to the relief of the poor in each of the Flaxton, Escrick, Bishopthorpe, and York Out-Relief Unions, and in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby order as follows; that is to say,—

ARTICLE 1. Subject to the provisions of the York Union (Out-Door Relief Regulation) Order every able-bodied male pauper who receives out-door relief within the Out-Relief Union shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say,—

Half at least of the relief given to the pauper shall be given in food, clothing and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians of the Out-Relief Union, or any of their officers, or any overseer of any parish or township in the Out-Relief Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2. The Guardians of the Out-Relief Union shall, within fourteen days after the date of this Order, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers are so set to work in the Out-Relief Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them are employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of the said able-bodied paupers as the Guardians deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board require.

ARTICLE 3. If the Guardians of the Out-Relief Union depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and within fifteen days after the said departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board approve of that departure, then the relief granted in the particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

ARTICLE 4. If at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief is so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-Door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians of

the Out-Relief Union, notwithstanding anything in the General Consolidated Order, 1847, may dispense with the services of such an officer.
