# MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

# Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames.

W HEREAS by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinaîter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinaîter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act of 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the borough of Kingston-upon-Thames have applied to the Local Government Board to make regulations:—

- (a) Under section 6 of the Act of 1896 and section 8 of the Act of 1903 for prohibiting the driving of motor cars upon the road known as Bank-lane, in the said borough, and
- (b) Under sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act of 1903, putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the said borough.

Notice is hereby further given that objections to the making of such regulations, or of either of them, may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their office aforesaid, on or before the seventh day of June, 1904.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the Council of the said borough, addressed to the Town Clerk, Town Clerk's Office, Clattern House, Kingstonupon-Thames.

# TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday, the 26th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 28th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
