J. Lloyd, of the Public Health and Marine Hospital Service, to reside at that port during the prevalence of the bubonic plague in the Vessels sailing from Callao which are provided with bills of health, countersigned by Dr. Lloyd, showing that the said vessels have been thoroughly disinfected before leaving, are allowed free and immediate pratique in the ports of the United States and of the Republic of Panama. For several weeks past no cases of plague have occurred at the port, but there are about sixty in the neighbourhood.
