say, with undeniable truth, in his "Book of the Royal Horticultural Society," "The results (of the work of the Society's collectors) "have affected the appearance of all England. Nowhere can a day's ride now be taken where the landscape is not beautified by some of the introductions of the Royal Horticultural Society.

Added to this, professional gardeners have been greatly assisted and encouraged by the help and support of our Society in the elaborate and valuable work of hybridization and selection, by which new and improved varieties of plants, fruits, and vegetables have been raised in vast

numbers.

The Fortnightly Shows of the Society have achieved a widespread celebrity. At them all the more interesting new plants, as well as the more important results of skilled horticultural effort, are first seen and first submitted to the judgment of the most competent experts in the

Kingdom.

The adherence of the Society to the work of promoting horticulture in all its branches can hardly fail to secure the approbation of the garden-loving race over whom Your Majesty reigns. This is shown by the rapid increase in the number of its Fellows, which has risen from about 1,300 in 1887 to 8,150 now. Every day witnesses advances in many directions, but no art or science has progressed more rapidly during the last 50 years than that of horticulture. The demand for flowers and fruits has grown to such an extent that it has developed a great and valuable industry, and the countenance which Your Majesties have graciously extended to our Society has largely assisted in creating, guiding, and helping this valuable national asset.

We take this opportunity of expressing our enduring obligations to Your Majesties for the many and gracious visits you have in years past paid to our Society's shows-visits which have done much to encourage us in our efforts to foster and maintain in the highest efficiency the science and art of horticulture. And in thanking Your Majesties for Your presence here to-day and for the warm interest You have ever shown in the Society, we desire to assure You that the valuable help the illustrious Prince Consort gave the Society in days of serious difficulty—now some 45 years ago—has never been forgotten.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker:—

BILLERICAY UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Billericay Union:—

· And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Billericay Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the

other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Billericay Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinalter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manuer prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the 'Workhouse and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.
