

of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum to be devoted exclusively to the payment of the salary or stipend of an assistant curate for the said united benefice and that the residue of the endowments of the said benefice of the Holy Trinity Minorities should under the provisions of the said eleventh section of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and forty-two be applied for the endowment or further endowment of some specified benefice being in the patronage of the Bishop of London for the time being and situate in the metropolis or the vicinity thereof provided that so long as the fabric of the church of the Holy Trinity Minorities should be left standing and should be used for the purpose prescribed in the said scheme and should be kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Bishop of London by the Incumbent of the said united benefice such Incumbent should be entitled to receive a further sum of thirty pounds per annum out of the said residue of the endowments of the benefice of the Holy Trinity Minorities.

"And whereas both of the said two events have occurred and the said sums of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum and thirty pounds per annum have become payable to the Incumbent of the said united benefice as from the fourteenth day of July in the year one thousand nine hundred and three.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint Mary, Stratford Bow, is in the patronage of the Bishop of London for the time being, and there is not a competent provision for the maintenance of the Incumbent thereof.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop, and also as the patron of the said united benefice of Saint Botolph Aldgate with the Holy Trinity Minorities (in testimony of which consent he has set his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme) and with the consent of the vestry of the parish of Saint Botolph Without Aldgate with which parish the parish of the Holy Trinity Minorities is now united (in testimony of which consent this scheme is signed by the chairman of a meeting of the said vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that as from the said fourteenth day of July in the year one thousand nine hundred and three and without any assurance in the law other than any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme the said residue of the endowments of the benefice of the Holy Trinity Minorities after the payment to the Incumbent of the said united benefice of the aforesaid sum of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum shall be transferred and annexed to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Stratford Bow, and the income accruing from time to time in respect of such residue of the said endowments shall be payable to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Stratford Bow, and to his successors for ever provided always that so long as the Incumbent of the said united benefice shall be entitled to receive the aforesaid sum of thirty pounds per annum out of the said residue of the endowments of the benefice of the Holy Trinity Minorities hereinbefore recommended to be transferred and annexed to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Stratford Bow, the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Stratford Bow, shall be entitled to receive that portion only of the said residue which shall

remain after the payment of the said sum of thirty pounds per annum.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint George, Gateshead, situate within the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Christ Church, Gateshead, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Christ Church, Gateshead, of the parish of Saint John, Gateshead Fell, in the said county and diocese, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Alban, Heworth, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes and parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Christ Church, Gateshead, of the said parish of Saint John, Gateshead Fell, and of the said new parish of Saint Alban, Heworth, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint George, Gateshead, situate as aforesaid,
