ORDER of the Local Government Board: Making certain General Orders applicable to the Union; and amending an applied Order as to Out-Relief (Outdoor Labour Test):—

GRIMSBY UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Grimsby Union:—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes and Townships comprised in the said Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by an Order dated the 5th day of March, 1890, We, the Local Government Board, ordered that the several Parishes and Townships therein named should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and form a Union, to be termed the Grimsby Union;

And whereas by virtue of, and in so far as is mentioned in, Our Order dated the 3rd day of April, 1890, the provisions of certain General Orders issued from time to time by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and by Us, were made applicable to and put in force in the said Grimsby Union;

And whereas by virtue of a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847 (hereinafter referred to as "the General Consolidated Order, 1847"), and issued by the Poor Law Commissioners, being one of the General Orders made applicable to the said Grimsby Union by the said Order dated the 3rd day of April, 1890, the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union are required to appoint a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour;

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the General Orders specified in the Schedule to this Order, issued from time to time by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and by Us, should also be made applicable to and be put in force in the said Union, and that further provision be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and four.

ARTICLE II.—The provisions of the General Orders specified in the Schedule to this Order shall apply to and be put in force in the Grimsby Union.

ARTICLE III.—(1.) Subject to the provisions of the General Order dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four (applied to and put in force in the Union by virtue of Article II of this Order), every able-bodied male pauper who receives outdoor relief within the Union shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say,—

Half at least of the relief given to the pauper shall be given in food, clothing and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish or Township in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

(2.) The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the date at which this Order comes into operation, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers are so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them are employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of the said able-bodied paupers as the Guardians deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board require.

(3.) If the Guardians depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and within fifteen days after the said departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board approve of that departure, then the relief granted in the particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

(4.) If at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief is so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour unnecessary, the Guardians, notwithstanding anything in the General Consolidated Order, 1847, may dispense with the services of such an officer.
