#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS an Army Council has been constituted under His Majesty's Letters Patent, and it is expedient to make such provision as is hereinafter contained with respect thereto:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:---

1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council.

All business, other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal divisions:—

- (a.) The first military member of the Army Council (the Chief of the General Staff), the second military member of the Army Council (the Adjutant-General), the third military member of the Army Council (the Quarter-Master-General), and the fourth military member of the Army Council (the Master-General of Ordnance) to be responsible. to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organization, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army as shall be assigned to them or each of them from time to time by the Secretary of State.
- (b.) The finance member of the Army Council to be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.
- (c.) The civil member of the Army Council to be responsible to the Secretary of State for

the non-effective votes, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

2. The Secretary of the War Office will act as Secretary of the Army Council, and will be charged with the interior economy of the War Office, and the preparation of all official communications of the Council, and with such other duties as the Secretary of State may from time to time assign to him.

#### BUSINESS OF A DRESSER OF FISH SKINS.

The London County Council hereby gives notice that it has made an Order declaring the business of a dresser of fish skins to be an offensive business within the meaning of Section 19, Sub-section 1 (b) of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and that the said Order has been duly confirmed by the Local Government Board. The Order is as follows :--

#### LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL.

Public Health (London) Act, 1891 (54 & 55 Vic. c. 76).

Whereas by Section 19 Sub-section 1 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, it is enacted as follows :-

If any person (a) Establishes anew the following businesses or any of them, that is to say, the business of blood boiler, bone boiler, manure manufacturer, soap boiler, tallow melter, or knacker; or

(b) Establishes anew without the sanction of the County Council the following businesses or any of them, that is to say, the business of fellmonger, tripe boiler, slaughterer of cattle or horses, or any other business which the County Council may declare by Order con-firmed by the Local Government Board and published in the London Gazette to be an offensive business,

he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds in respect of the establishment thereof, and any person carrying on the same when established shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds for every day during which he so carries on the same.

And whereas it has been represented to the London County Council being the County Council mentioned in the above Section that the business of a dresser of fish skins is an offensive business and ought to be so declared, and the said Council after due enquiry and consideration have deter-mined to make an Order accordingly. Now, the London County Council in pursuance of the provisions of the above-mentioned Statute, do by this Order declare for the purposes of the said Statute that the following business is an offensive business, that is to say, the business of a dresser of fish skins, that is to say, any business in which fish skins are trimmed, cleansed, scraped or dried. In witness whereof the said Council have caused their Common Seal to be hereunto affixed the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and four.

#### ST. JOHN.

Cape Hermes Light—Amended Particulars of. With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 295 of 1904 :-

The Government of Cape Colony has given notice that the light to be established in September, in a light tower now being constructed on Cape Hermes, St. John or Umzimvubu River, is as follows:--The light will be white flashing every three seconds, the duration of each flash being a quarter of a second; it will be elevated 180 feet above high water, visible in clear weather from a distance of 20 miles, and shown from an octagonal tower of dark grey masonry, 44 feet high, with a white lantern; it has been placed on the Chart at a distance of half a cable N. 48° W. from the extremity of the Cape. The light will be visible from the bearing of N. 67° E., through north and west, to S. 78° W., and obscured by the land in other directions; except in the entrance, there it will be visible to S. 3° W. The light power will be 30,000 candles.

Approximate position, lat. 31° 38' S., long. 29° 33<sup>1</sup>/ E.

Porer Rock Auxiliary Light-Intended Alteration in Character of.

The Austrian Government has given notice, dated 25th July, 1904, that it is intended to alter the character of the auxiliary light on the south end of Porer Rock from fixed to a quick flashing light.
