AUXILIARY HOME IN THE BRUNSWICK ROAD, LEITH WALK, EDINBURGH.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that he has this day issued his Certificate that the old premises of the Original Industrial School for Girls in the Brunswick-road, Leith Walk, Edinburgh, are fitted to be an Auxiliary Home in connection with the new School at Gilmerton, for the reception of such Girls not exceeding 25 in number, as, in pursuance of the Industrial Schools

Act, 1866 (29 and 30 Vic., cap. 118), and the Acts amending the same, may be sent thereto from time to time.
