BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Order made under Section 20 of the Elementary Education Act, 1873.

Whereas the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education did, on the twentieth day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, make an Order determining the manner in which notices required by the Elementary Education Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be published by the School Board for London:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Order:

Now therefore the Board of Education by virtue and in pursuance of the powers in them vested under the Education Acts, 1870-1903, the Board of Education Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The said Order of the twentieth day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, is hereby revoked.
2. Notices required by the Elementary Education Act, 1870 (section 20) to be published by the Local Education Authority for the Administrative County of London shall, so far as they relate to land situate within that County, unless otherwise expressly provided or otherwise determined by any Order of the Board of Education, be published by advertisement only, such manner of publication being in the opinion of the Board of Education sufficient for giving information to all persons interested.
3. The advertisement shall be published during three consecutive weeks in four daily newspapers circulating in the Administrative County of London.
