Turin, June 1.

He Prince of Commercy is arrived here, his Regiment of Horfe having passed by this place on the 26th of the last Month in their march to our Camp Vigen. The rest of the German Troops arrive daily, near Vigon. Hydelberg, June 4. The French having drawn together about 12 or 14000 Men between Winzingen and Musbach, they decamped yesterday and marched under the Command of the Marquis d'Uxeller, towards Menz; They are Building a Fort at Altrip, on which 1000 Peasants are now at Work, whom they have Summoned from Neckerau and other Places thereabouts. Hamburg, June 10. We have advice from the Court of Hamburg, That 4000 Horse and 4000 Foot of the Troops of Lanenburg, are ordered to march forthwith, under the Command of Prince Maximilian, the Duke of Hambur's Third Son, towards the Reine or Flanders.

Cologue, June 10. The French have this Week made an Incussion into the Country of Enfelt, where they had on the 4th instant a skirmith near Euskirken, with a Party of Neuburgers, and objued them (being much weaker

of Neuburgers, and obliged them (being much weaker than the Enemy) to retire towards Zulpich; Of the Neuburgers about 20 were killed, and 10 or 12 of the French, who afterwards burnt feveral Villages in the Dutchy of Juliers. On Saturday last came to this place 40 Troopers and Dragoons, who had Deferted the French Service, with their Horfes, which they fold here. The Troops of the Elector of Cologne, to the number of about 2000 Foot, and 300 Horfe, are now on their march to joyn with those of Neuburg; The Munfteriens in Garifon here have Orders to march; The Bishop of Munster offers to send 4000 Men more to join with the other Confederates on the Rhine; and the Electors of Cologne and Palatin have thereupon sent Envoys to that Bishop to regulate Matters about the march and subsistance of the said Forces. From Francfort we have advice, That the Marquis d'Uxelles being reinsorced with some French Troops from the Moselle, was come within two Leagues of Menz, having with him a Train of Artillery of about 20 Field Pieces, the biggest of them 8 Pounders, and 2 Mortars. The Enemy to form this Body have emptied all their Garisons in Alsace, leaving those Places to be guarded by the Peasants; and their chief design seems to be to detroy the Forage, and Ruia the Country. At the same time we understand, that the Forces of the Landegrave of H see are on their march to join with those of Franconia and Suabia, (which alone make 24000 Men) and the other Confederates that are deligned to act on the Upper Rhine.
