EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCE.

Order of Secretary of State No. 4 (a) relating to the deposit of explosives for conveyance as refuse.

Whereas by Part I (section 37) of the Explosives Act, 1875 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), it is provided that a Secretary of State may from time to time make bye-laws for regulating the conveyance, loading and unloading of gunpowder, in any case in which bye-laws made under any other provision of the Act do not apply, and in particular for declaring or regulating all or any of the matters thereinafter following:

And whereas by Part II (section 39) of the Act it is declared that, subject to the provisions subsequently in Part II of the Act contained, Part I of the Act relating to gunpowder shall apply to every other description of explosive in like manner as if the provisions of Part I of the

Act were re-enacted in Part II, with the substitution of that description of explosive for gunpowder:

And whereas it has been brought to my notice that danger to the public has been caused by the depositing of explosives in receptacles for refuse:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the said power, I, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order that the following bye-laws shall be observed:—

1. Explosive shall not be deposited in any receptacle or place appropriated for refuse, and shall not be handed or forwarded to any dustman or other person employed in the removal of refuse, unless due notice has been given to such dustman or person, or to the dustman or person whose duty it is to remove refuse from such receptacle or place.

2. Explosive shall not be conveyed in any carriage or boat appropriated for the removal of refuse.

In the event of any breach (by any act or default) of the foregoing bye-laws, or any attempt to commit such breach:—

The person committing the offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding in the case of the first offence £10, and in the case of the second offence, or any subsequent offence, £20, and also the following persons, viz., the owner of the carriage or boat in respect of which, or containing the explosive in respect of which, the offence is committed, the person in charge of such carriage, and the person owning such explosive, shall each be liable to a similar penalty unless he proves that he had supplied proper means and issued proper orders for the observance, and used due diligence to enforce the observance, of these bye-laws.

MERSEY CONSERVANCY ACT.

Mersey Conservancy, 66, Victoria-street, London, S.W., November 2, 1904.

I hereby give notice, pursuant to the 9th section of the Act 5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 110, intituled "An Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey," that I have received a notice from the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, given pursuant to the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, of their intention to close Anderton Basin, Liverpool, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at this office, a copy of which notice is subjoined.

F.R.S., &c., Acting Conservator of the Mersey. In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vict., cap. 110), I, Miles Kirk Burton, General Manager and Secretary of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, hereby give notice that the said Board propose to close the Anderton Basin at Liverpool by constructing a wall across its entrance, as shown on the plan deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy. The wall would be about 100 feet long constructed in masonry or concrete, approximately uniform in profile with the existing river wall on each side of the basin in line therewith.

The object of the work is to allow of the filling up of the basin in order to provide additional quay space in connection with increased accommodation for shipping which is being provided in the new docks adjoining.

The work will be commenced in two months' time. It will exclude the tide from the site of the Anderton Basin, but will not impede or interrupt the tidal flow of the River Mersey.

THE COMPANIES (WINDING-UP) ACT, 1890. THE COMPANIES ACIS, 1862 to 1900.

By virtue of the powers conferred upon them by section 27 of the Companies (Winding-up) Act, 1890, the Board of Trade, with the concurrence of the Treasury, have assigned the matters arising in the execution of the said Act by the Board of Trade to a new Department of the said Board to be called the Companies Department, and have appointed Mr. George Stapylton Barnes to be Comptroller of the Companies Department. The duties of the Companies Department. The duties of the Comptroller will include the general direction, under the control of the Board of Trade, of the said Department as regards the said matters so assigned to it, and he will also act, under the same control, for the Board of Trade in regard to the duties and powers imposed or conferred on the said Board by the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1900, and by the Newspaper Libel and Registration Act, 1881, and also in relation to matters connected with Charters and Chartered Companies.

The Official Receivers throughout the country are to report to and correspond with the Comptroller of the Companies Department in regard to all matters relating to the Winding-up of Companies.
