PETROLEUM ACT, 1871.

Licences for Carbide of Calcium.

With reference to the granting of licences for carbide of calcium by Local Authorities under the Petroleum Acts, it has been represented to the Secretary of State that the removal of the limitation of quantity to be contained in any one vessel would be of advantage to the Trade. The Secretary of State is of opinion that this limitation may safely be removed, inasmuch as there is, in his opinion, no increase of danger in the use of larger vessels either in conveyance or storage. provided that the vessel is strong in proportion to the weight of its contents.

The Secretary of State also wishes to bring to the notice of Local Authorities the fact that, whereas it is desirable to insert some condition in the Licenses as to the carbide being rendered inaccessible to unauthorized persons, it is seldom necessary to require that each containing vessel should be fitted with a lock.

Seas King, Defender of the Faith, to the President, Vice-Presidents, Council and Members of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Greeting!

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria did by Roya. Charter bearing date at Westminster the eighth day of March, in the seventh year of Her Reign, will, grant, ordain and declare that the persons therein named together with such others of Her late Majesty's subjects as then held certificates of qualification to practise as Veterinary Surgeons granted by the Royal Veterinary College of London, or by the Veterinary College of Edinburgh, respectively, and such other persons as respectively then were, or might thereafter become, Students of the Royal Veterinary College of London, or of the Veterinary College of Edinburgh, or of such other Veterinary College, corporate or unincorporate, as then was, or thereafter should be, established for the purposes of education in Veterinary Surgery, whether in London or elsewhere in Our United Kingdom, and which should be authorized in that behalf under the Sign Manual of Her late Majesty or of any of Her Royal Successors, and as might pass the examination required by the Orders, Rules, and Bye-laws, framed and confirmed pursuant to the said Royal Charter, should by virtue of the said Royal Charter be members of and form one body politic and corporate by the name of "The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons":

And whereas the University of Liverpool has in pursuance of the powers conferred by Our Charter of the 15th day of July, in the third year of Our Reign, prescribed and established a Veterinary Board, and has made provision for education in Veterinary Medicine and Surgery with an efficient staff of teachers:

And whereas the University of Liverpool has thereby become a Veterinary College: And whereas a Veterinary College established at Edinburgh, called the New Veterinary College of Edinburgh, was, by Warrant under the Sign Manual of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the 8th day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, duly authorized in terms of the provisions of the aforesaid Royal Charter of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons:

And whereas the said New Veterinary College of Edinburgh have for divers reasons to Ourselves as to them appearing sufficient surrendered, waived and given back into Our Hands the said warrant and all the authorities, benefits and privi-

leges granted to them thereby:

And whereas it has been humbly represented unto Us that the benefits of the University of Liverpool would be greatly extended and the interests of the veterinary profession and of the public promoted were We graciously pleased to authorize the said University, and place it under the operation of the said Royal Charter of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons:

Now know Ye, that We do hereby accept the surrender of the aforesaid Warrant of the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and of the authorities, benefits and privileges thereunder conferred on the said New Veterinary College of Edinburgh: And We will and declare that the said authorities, benefits and privileges shall, from the date hereof, abso-

lutely cease and determine.

Provided, nevertheless, that all matters and things duly done and performed, and all titles, privileges and benefits accrued and gained, by any of Our Subjects, in pursuance of the said Warrant before the date of these Presents, shall remain valid and in full force according to the that any students who pass to the Veterinary School at Liverpool from the New Veterinary College of Edinburgh shall retain the same status and privileges in relation to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons as if they had continued members of the New Veterinary College of Edinburgh:

And further We do hereby authorize the said University of Liverpool in terms of the provisions of the aforesaid Royal Charter of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons: And We will and declare that the persons who now are, or may hereafter become, students of the said University of Liverpool, and shall pass the examination prescribed by the said Royal Charter, shall be Members of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, therein incorporated, and shall be entitled to all the privileges given to such Members by the said Charter.

Given at Our Court at Sandringham, the fifth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and four, in the fourth year of Our Reign.

The marks assigned to Candidates in each branch (except in Mathematics and English Composition) will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that a Candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer.

Candidates are at liberty to name any of these branches of knowledge, with the proviso that the maximum number of marks that can be obtained from the subjects chosen is limited to 6,000. If this maximum is exceeded by a Candidate's selection he will be required to indicate one of his subjects the marks for which should, in his case, be reduced so as to bring his maximum marks within the prescribed limit. The marks so reduced will be subject to a correspondingly reduced deduction.

- 3. Application for permission to attend one of these Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.
- 4. A fee of £6 will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.

5. Out of the list resulting from each Examination will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified):—

(a) All the vacancies in Class I which may have been reported to the Civil Service Commissioners up to the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination;

(b) Any additional vacancies occurring within six months from the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination, which the Head of the Department may desire to have so filled.

Candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, among the vacancies (a) for which they are duly qualified; or they may elect to wait for the chance of a vacancy (b). When vacancies (b) occur, they will be offered in rotation to the qualified Candidates then on the list, who will be free to decline them without forfeiting their claim to subsequent vacancies (b).

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Metropolitan Electric Tramways Limited under powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act, 1870, for regulating the travelling in or upon any carriage belonging to the Company.

- 3. All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.
- 4. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise.
- 5. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars or cigarettes inside any carriage.
- 6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any carriage, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or tramway station or premises used in connection with the tramways system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall sing or play or perform on any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements, pamphlets, notices, handbills or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or paste notices or handbills, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any
- 7. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease, or who in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or on any carriage, and may be prevented from entering in or on any carriage, and shall not enter or mount in or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor; and if found in or on any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage. Any person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage or other duly authorized officer as aforesaid soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage.
- 8. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.
- 9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, linings or other fittings of any carriage, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or place his feet upon or lie upon any seat, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage, and no person not being a servant of the Company duly authorized in that behalf shall touch, handle or interfere with any electric machine or appliance in, under, upon or about any carriage (except electric bells provided for the use of passengers). Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to pay the amount of any damage done in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations.
- 10. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the or in any way injured or from any cause unable

- Company, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 1. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded firearms, or with any dangerous or offensive substance or material or
- 12. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey and accept a ticket corresponding thereto.
- 13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the journey.
- 14. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible, or shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey.
- 15. Any ticket for the time being issued by the Company in respect of fares shall be only available for the carriage on or for which it is issued, except in the case of transfer two-journey or season tickets (if any), and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any carriage for any purpose whatever at any stage and resume his journey by any carriage without the payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger resumed his journey.
- 16. No luggage which in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company from its size or otherwise is unsuitable for conveyance in or upon a carriage shall be taken in or upon such carriage. Any personal luggage carried by passengers shall be placed in such part of the carriage as the conductor or other duly authorized officer as aforesaid may direct, and if placed on a platform of the carriage shall be carried at the owner's risk. No package or luggage of any description unaccompanied by a passenger shall be conveyed upon any carriage except under any regulations or restrictions which the Company may adopt.
- 17. No passenger or person other than a servant of the Company so authorized shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platform of any carriage, or sit on the outside rail on the roof or platform of any carriage, and any person so travelling or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.
- 18. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers (except as hereinafter provided).
- 19. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.
- 20. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any carriage
- 21. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled

to proceed the passengers shall upon the request of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company leave the same, and if such passengers shall have paid their fares shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid. No person shall except with the leave of the conductor or other duly authorized officer as aforesaid enter a disabled or injured carriage.

- 22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each and every such offence, and shall in addition be liable to be immediately removed from the carriage, and if such person shall have paid his fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.
- 23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
- 24. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1905.
