into effect agreements and arrangements with regard to any matters relating to any of the abovementioned railways or portions of railway, or any other railways of the contracting parties, including agreements and arrangements as to running powers and facilities over or in connection with such railways or portions of railway, or any of them, and the interchange and transmission of traffic therewith and thereon, and other traffic arrangements for the development of the traffic of the districts served by such railways or portions of railway, or any of them.

To authorize and require the Rhymney Company to construct, maintain, provide and work in connection with their railway, and in order that they may afford due facilities for traffic destined for or coming from the docks of the Company at Cardiff, proper and sufficient reception sidings and interchange sidings, to such extent, in such manner, at such times and at such places or otherwise as shall or may be provided in the Bill, and to make provision for the working by the Rhymney Company of traffic between the docks of the Company and such sidings, and also upon such sidings, including the marshalling, sorting, regulation, forwarding, handling and disposal of traffic, and arrangements for dealing with empty or loaded wagons.

To alter, amend or repeal, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the Bill, all or some of the provisions of the Act before-mentioned, and of the following local Acts, that is to say : The Bute Docks and Cardiff Railway Acts, 1865 to 1904, 20 and 21 Vict., cap. 140, and all other Acts relating to the Rhymney Company and their Undertaking; 5 and 6 Wm. IV, cap. 107, and all other Acts relating to the Great Western Company and their Undertaking; 9 and 10 Vict., cap. 204, and all other Acts relating to the North Western Company and their Undertaking; 22 and 23 Vict., cap. 68, and all other Acts relating to the Brecon Company and their Undertaking; 47 and 48 Vict., cap. 257, and all other Acts relating to the Barry Company and their Undertaking; and any other Act or Acts of Parliament recited in any of the before-mentioned Acts or affecting any of the above Companies.

To vary or extinguish any rights and privileges which would interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, on or before the 17th day of December next.

## (b) Railways.
