privileges, and by borrowing on mortgage, and by the creation and issue of debenture stock, or

by any of such means.

To authorize and provide for the issue by the Company of certificates (transferable by delivery) of the amounts of any debenture stock to which the holder is entitled, and to provide for payment by means of coupons or otherwise of interest on the stock included in any such certificate and to make any necessary incidental provisions with regard to the issue and transfer of such certificates, and with regard to the rights, privileges, and obligations of the holders of such certificates and coupons, and to apply the provisions of Sections 34 to 36 of the Companies Act, 1867, to such certificates and coupons, and to persons committing in relation thereto the offences in the said sections specified.
