ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH DECEMBER 1904.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Holding of Special Sales of Fat Swine.

- 1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, and the Order of the Board dated the nineteenth day of November last, a sale of fat swine may be held at the premises and on the dates mentioned in the Schedule hereto, on the following conditions:—
- (i.) The swine must be moved to the sale with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, which Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the sale by the person in charge of the swine to a person appointed by the Local Authority to receive the same.
- (ii.) The swine exposed at a sale authorised under this Order may be moved from the sale along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Swine-Fever Infected Area to a bacon factory or slaughter-house specified in the Licence if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District.
- (iii.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (iv.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (v.) The Licence under this Order for the movement of swine from the sale to a bacon factory or slaughter-house shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.
- (vi.) The swine shall be detained at the bacon factory or slaughter-house until they are slaughtered.

Attendance at Sales of Veterinary Inspector.

2. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at each sale authorised under this Order.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 3.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Bongao Island-Light Established.

The United States Government has given notice, dated 25th June, 1904, that a white fixed lantern light, elevated about 35 feet above high water, has been established on a pole surmounting a beaton of three piles erected on the extremity of the reef extending from the eastern point of Bongao Island, at the entrance to Port Bongao; it has been placed on the Chart at a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ cables N. 20° E. from the extremity of Martinez Point.

Approximate position on Chart No. 2576, lat. 5° 2' N., long. 119° $46\frac{1}{2}$ ' E.
