Money paid into Court in action remitted to County Court.

Where money has been paid into Court in an action which is subsequently remitted to a County Court, the money shall be subject to any Order made in the action by the County Court as if it were an Order of the High Court.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Denbigh) Order, 1904.

Dated 20th December, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Denbigh, I hereby make the following Order :---

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Denbigh) Order, 1904.

BIRDS.

Partial Extension of Close Time.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the county of Denbigh so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of October in any year :-

American Quail, Auk, Avocet, Bee Eater, Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulterneb, Cuckoo, Dotterel, Dunlin, Fulmar, Gannet, Godwit, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot, Gull (except black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kittiwake, Loon, Marrot, Merganser, Murre, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, or Night Hawk), Oriole Oxbird Owter Gatabase Oriole, Oxbird, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Ploverspage, Puffin, Purre, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Seamew, Sea Parrot, Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Sheldrake, Skua, Smew, Solan Goose, Sponbill, Stint, Stone Ourlew (Thick Knee), Stonehatch, Summersnipe, Tarrock, Tern, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Willock, Woodpecker.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Denbigh to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:-

Yellow Bunting, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Hedge Sparrow, Raven, Redstart, Robin Redbreast, Red-backed Shrike, Starling, Thrush, Treegrapper. Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Wheatear, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the county of Denbigh :-

Common Buzzard, Goldfinch, Heron, Kingfisher, Lark, Linnet (brown and green), Owl, Siskin.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified to be dangerous certain machinery used in the process of spiuning in textile factories and known as self-acting mules, and that he proposes to make Regulations to apply to all factories or parts thereof in which the process of spinning by means of self-acting mules is carried on.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained at the office of the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London.

Objections to the draft Kegulations by or on behalf of any person affected by the Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State within 40 days from the date of this notice.

The Companies (Winding-up) Act, 1890.

Whereas by an Order of the Board of Trade, dated 14th April, 1890, made under the provisions of section 66 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, it was directed inter alia that there should be two Official Receivers for the Bankruptcy Districts of the County Courts holden at Ipswich, Bury St. Edmunds, and Colchester.

And whereas by such Order Mr. Cecil Mercer and Mr. Frederick Messent were appointed to be the Official Receivers for the said Bankruptcy Districts.

And whereas by a further Order dated 1st IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following (Winding-up) Act, 1890, it was *inter alia* ordered that Mr. Cecil Mercer should be the Official Receiver attached to the said Courts for the purposes of that Act.

And whereas the Board of Trade have determined, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, that there shall in future be one Official Receiver only for the Bankruptcy Districts of the said Courts.

the Bankruptcy Districts of the said Courts. Now therefore the Board of Trade do hereby revoke the said Orders in so far as they direct that there shall be two Official Receivers for the Bankruptcy Districts of the County Courts holden at Ipswich, Bury St. Edmunds, and Colchester, and in so far as they relate to the appointment of Mr. Cecil Mercer to be an Official Receiver for the said Districts, but without prejudice to anything done or suffered under the said Orders.

And it is further ordered that the said Mr. Frederick Messent shall become and be the Official Receiver attached to the said Courts for all the purposes of the Bankruptcy Acts, 1883 to 1890, and the Companies (Winding-up) Act, 1890.

This Order shall commence and come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1905.

Whereas the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales did, by resolution passed at a general meeting held on the fourth day of October, 1904, adopt new Bye-laws, and at a subsequent general meeting held on the first day of November, 1904, did confirm the said resolution, and the said Bye-laws have been submitted to the Lords of the Council.

And whereas by the 26th Article of the Charter of Incorporation of the said Institute it is provided that Bye-laws made by the Institute shall not have effect until they have been submitted to and allowed by the Lords of the Privy Council.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said Bye-laws into consideration (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed), are pleased to allow the same.

BYE-LAWS referred to in the foregoing Order.

Chapter I.—Preliminary.

 These Bye-laws, made under the abovementioned Royal Charter (in these Bye-laws referred to as the Royal Charter), shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1905, or so soon thereafter as they may be allowed by the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.
 Words in these Bye-laws have the same

2. Words in these Bye-laws have the same meaning as in the Royal Charter; and references herein to Members, Fellows, Associates, and Meetings shall, unless the contrary intention appear, be construed as having reference to Members, Fellows, Associates, and Meetings of the Institute.

Articled Clerk means a Clerk who is serving under articles to a Member of the Institute.

Secretary means the Secretary of the Institute appointed by the Council, or the person acting in that capacity by the direction of the Council.

3. The forms set forth in the Schedule to these Bye-laws, and such other forms as the Council may from time to time authorize, shall be used in the cases to which they are applicable, with such alterations or additions thereto, if any, as the Council may from time to time determine; and all notes and directions thereon shall be deemed part of the forms, and be observed accordingly.

Chapter II.-The Council.

4. The number of the Members of the Council shall be forty-five, of whom nine shall retire at each Annual Meeting of the Institute, but shall be eligible for re-election. Subject to the provisions of Bye-law 10, the retiring Members at each Annual Meeting shall be those who have been longest in office.

5. At each Annual Meeting every returing Member of the Council shall, unless he shall have signified to the Council his desire not to offer himself for re-election, be deemed to be nominated for election

6. As regards any other candidate or candidates to be nominated for election on the Council

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at an Annual Meeting, previous notice of each such nomination in writing, signed by ten Members, shall be sent to the Secretary on or before the tenth day of April; and such notice shall be accompanied by an intimation in writing from the candidate of his willingness to serve, if elected, and the receipt of such notice and intimation shall be stated in the circular issued by the Council before each Annual Meeting. If sufficient candidates be not elected on the Council at an Annual Meeting, the vacancies may be filled up by the Council at a Meeting summoned with notice of the object.

7. The office of a Member of the Council is vacated—

1. If he cease to be a Member of the Institute, or be excluded or suspended for any period from membership.

2. If he be absent from the meetings of the Council for more than six consecutive months without the consent of the Council.

3. If he become bankrupt, or suspend payment, or compound with or make an assignment of his property for the benefit of his creditors.

4. If he be declared lunatic, or become of unsound mind.

5. If he be convicted of a felony.

8. A Member of the Council may resign his office by sending in his resignation to the Council, and on its acceptance by the Council, but not until then, he shall cease to be a Member of the Council.

9. The Institute may at any time, by a resolution passed by a majority of two-thirds of the votes of Members present and voting at a Special Meeting, remove any Member of the Council from his office before the expiration of his period of office (provided that if a poll be demanded as to the resolution for removal, the same majority of two-thirds shall be necessary on the taking of the poll for carrying that resolution); and may, by a resolution passed by a majority of the votes of Members present and voting at that Meeting, elect another qualified person in his stead. The person so elected shall hold office during such time only as the Member in whose place he was elected would have been entitled to hold the same if he had not been removed from office.

10. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Council between two Annual Meetings, the vacancy may be filled up by the Council at a Meeting summoned with notice of this object; and a person so becoming a Member of the Council shall ho'd office only during the time the vacating Member would have been entitled to hold office, but shall be eligible for re-election.

Chapter III.—Proceedings and Powers of the Council.

11. The Council shall meet at the Institute on the first Wednesday in each month, or at such other times and places as they may determine.

12. A Meeting of the Council may at any time be called by order of the President or Vicc-President, or at the request in writing, addressed to the Secretary, of five Members of the Council.

13. Three clear days' notice of a Meeting of the Council, or twenty-four hours' notice in a case of emergency, shall be delivered or sent to each Member of the Council at his registered address, and such notice shall, so far as practicable, contain a statement of the business to be transacted at such Meeting. It shall not be necessary in any case to prove that such notice has been delivered or sent, but the same shall be taken as delivered or duly sent unless the contrary be shown; and the non-receipt of any notice by any Member, or the non-existence of any supposed emergency, shall not affect the validity of the proceedings of any Meeting.

14. At all Meetings of the Council the President, or in his absence the Vice-President, shall be Chairman; or, in the absence of both, the Chairman shall be elected from among those present.

15. At all Meetings of the Council, in the event of difference of opinion, the vote of the majority shall prevail (except where otherwise required by the Royal Charter or Bye-laws); and, in case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote, in addition to his original vote.

16. Subject to the provisions of the foregoing Bye-laws, the Chairman of any Meeting of the Council may, with the consent of the Meeting, adjourn the Meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned Meeting other than the business left unfinished at the Meeting from which the adjournment took place. No notice need be given of an adjourned Meeting unless it be so directed in the resolution for adjournment.

17. Except where otherwise required by the Royal Charter or Bye-laws, seven Members of the Council shall form a quorum.

18. At the first ordinary Meeting of the Council after each Annual Meeting, the Members of the Council then present shall choose one of the Members of the Council as President, and another as Vice-President, for the year following such choice; and any vacancy in either of those offices shall be filled up at the next monthly or other ordinary Meeting of the Council.

19. Minutes shall be made, in proper books to be provided for the purpose, of all resolutions and proceedings of Meetings of the Council and of the Committees thereof; and every Minute signed by the Chairman of the Meeting to which it relates, or by the Chairman of a subsequent Meeting, shall be sufficient evidence of the facts therein stated.

20. All moneys received by the Institute shall be paid into the account of the Institute at its Bankers; and cheques drawn upon its Bankers shall be signed by two Members of the Council and countersigned by the Secretary.

21. All funds of the Institute not needed immediately for the ordinary purposes of the Institute may be invested in the name of the Institute or of any two or more Members of the Council, in any securities in which Trustees are from time to time authorized to invest by virtue of the Trustee Act, 1893, or any subsequent Act amending the same, with power from time to time to sell or vary such securities. The Council may also from time to time place money on deposit with Bankers to be selected by them.

22. The Council may, with the consent of a General Meeting, employ any part of the funds of the Institute in the payment of lecturers, or the foundation of prizes, scholarships, or exhibitions in connection with the subjects of the examinations conducted or held by the Institute as well as for any other general purposes of the Institute.

23. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Council may from time to time borrow money temporarily, and may pay interest thereon.

24. The Council may, with the consent of a General Meeting, make such provision for pensioning retired Officers and servants whether by agreement at the time of appointment or employment, or otherwise, as to the Council may seem just.

25. The Council may pay out of the funds of the Institute the first-class railway fare of a Member of the Council not residing or practising within the Metropolis, as defined by the Royal Charter or Bye-laws, on each occasion of such Member attending a Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee thereof; or, being an examiner, presiding at an examination.

26. The Council shall in each year publish or cause to be published at the expense of the Institute, or otherwise, a list of the Members of the Institute, together with such other particulars in respect to the Institute or its objects as they may deem advisable; and they may in such list in their discretion distinguish, in such way as shall to the Council seem fit, the Fellows and Associates in practice and bolding Certificates of Membership under Section 16 of the Royal Charter in that year, and the Fellows and Associates not in practice, or may publish the List in any other form they determine upon; and such List shall be supplied to Members and others at such prices, or gratuitously, as the Council shall from time to time determine.

27. For the purpose of publishing such List, each Member shall, in January in each year, send in to the Secretary his name and address, or place of business, failing which the List may be drawn up on such information as the Council may possess.

28. All notices required by the Royal Charter or these Bye-laws to be given to Members shall be forwarded by post to such address as may last have been registered at the Institute. And, in proving that such notice has been given, it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was properly addressed and put in the post. Members who have no registered address in England or Wales shall not be entitled to have notices sent to them.

29. Subject to the provisions of the Royal Charter and Bye-laws, the Council may appoint Committees from among themselves, and may fix the quorum thereof, and may delegate any of their powers to such Committees, and may lay down rules for regulating the proceedings of such Committees; and the President and Vice-President shall be, by virtue of their offices, members of all Committees.

30. The Common Seal shall be kept in such custody as the Council may from time to time determine.

31. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any instrument, except by order of the Council, and in the presence of two Members of the Council; and every such instrument shall be signed by the two Members of the Council in whose presence the Seal is affixed, and countersigned by the Secretary.

Chapter IV.—Members.

32. All admissions and elections of Members shall be by the Council, and every applicant for admission or election to any degree of membership shall satisfy the Council of his having fulfilled the conditions specified by the Royal Charter in such manner as the Council shall require, and shall also produce such evidence of his fituess to be so admitted or elected as the Council shall deem necessary; and the Council may, in their absolute discretion by resolution passed at a Meeting of the Council, at which Meeting there shall be present and voting not less than twelve Members of the Council, and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of the Members present and voting shall vote, refuse to admit or elect to any degree of membership, any person whom they shall not consider to be a fit and proper person to be so admitted or elected.

33. No person shall be admitted to membership before he has attained the age of twentyone years. 34. The Council may, at a Meeting convened as prescribed by section 14 of the Royal Charter, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, elect as an Associate any candidate for admission who, having been prior to the 21st March, 1882, in practice as a Public Accountant, or having been employed as a Public Accountant's clerk, has, from that date up to the day of his application, been continuously in practice or employed as a Public Accountant's clerk, or partly in practice and partly so employed.

An admission under this Bye-law shall be made subject to the candidate passing the Final Examination under the Royal Charter; and shall date from the adoption by the Council of the Report of the Examination Committee that such candidate has passed the said examination to the satisfaction of the said Committee.

Provided that any person who before these Bye-laws shall have come into operation has passed an Examination equivalent to the Final Examination and would as a result have been entitled under the Bye-laws at that time existing to apply for admission shall still be entitled so to apply.

35. The Council may, at a Meeting convened as prescribed by Section 14 of the Royal Charter, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, admit as Fellow or Associate, as the case may be, every person who would have been eligible under the provisions of Section 5, Sub-section (3) or (4), or under Section 6 of the Royal Charter, but for the fact that his practice or service has, on account of ill-health or for causes satisfactory to the Council, not been continuous.

35A. The Council may, on or before the 15th November, 1906, at a Meeting convened as pre-scribed by Section 14 of the Royal Charter, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, at which Meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four Members of the Council, elect as a Fellow or Associate any candidate for admission who has, up to the date of his application, been continuously in practice as a Public Accountant for ten years. An admission under this Bye-Law shall be made subject to the candidate passing the Final Examination under the Royal Charter to be held on or before the 31st December, 1906; and shall date from the adoption by the Council of the Report of the Examination Committee that such candidate has passed the said examination to the satisfaction of the said Committee.

[Norg.—This Bye-law to be left out of all reprints of the Bye-laws issued on or after the 1st January, 1907.]

36. Any Member may resign his Membership by sending in his resignation to the Council, and on its acceptance by the Council, but not until then, he shall cease to be a Member; but the Council may at any time, at a Meeting convened as prescribed by Section 14 of the Royal Charter, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, re-admit him to Membership.

37. Every person who is admitted a Fellow without becoming an Associate shall, on admission, pay the sum of $\pounds 21$ as entrance fee.

38. Every Associate shall, upon being elected a Fellow, pay the sum of $\pounds 10$ 10s. as additional entrance fee.

39. Every person who is admitted an Associate shall pay the sum of £10 10s. as entrance fee.

40. No person shall become a Fellow or Associate of the Institute unless he shall have paid the entrance fee prescribed by these Bye-laws; and if he do not pay such entrance fee within two months after notice given him by post to pay the same, the admission or election shall be void. 41. Every person before becoming a Member shall undertake to be bound by the Royal Charter and by the Bye-laws in force at the time of his admission or election, or which may thereafter from time to time be made.

42. Upon a person being admitted to the Institute, and upon his commencing to practise, and upon his being elected to Fellowship, he shall in each event be entitled to a certificate to that effect under seal.

43. Each Member obtaining from the Council a certificate of his Membership under Section 16 of the Royal Charter, shall pay to the Council, for the use of the Institute, the sum prescribed in that section as the maximum sum payable in his case, which sum is in these Bye-laws referred to as the annual certificate fee.

44. The annual certificate fee shall be deemed to become due and payable in January in each year, or in the case of a Member elected or admitted or beginning to practise after January in any year, at the date of his election or admission or beginning to practise: Provided that in the case of Members admitted to Membership or elected to Fellowship after the last day of September in any year, only half the fee for the current year, or half the additional fee, as the case may be, shall become due and payable.

45. The Council shall not in any year issue to any person the annual certificate of Membership under Section 16 of the Royal Charter until the annual certificate fee has been paid by him.

46. Every Member not in practice shall pay to the Institute an annual subscription in the case of a Fellow of two guineas, and in the case of an Associate of one guinea; and the same shall be deemed to become due and payable in January in each year, or in the case of a Member elected or admitted after January in any year, then at the date of his election or admission: Provided that in the case of a Member admitted to Membership after the last day of September in any year only half the annual subscription for the current year shall become due and payable: Provided always, that in the event of such Fellow or Associate commencing practice during the currency of any year for which such subscription shall have been paid, he shall have credit for the sum so paid on account of his annual certificate fee.

47. The annual certificate granted upon payment of a certificate fee or subscription shall be given under the hand of the Secretary.

48. For the purposes of Section 16 of the Royal Charter, the year shall be reckoned from the first of January.

49. A Member shall from time to time, and in such manner as the Council may require, satisfy the Council us to whether he is, or is not, in practice.

50. Every Member of the Institute who is a partner in a firm practising and having an office in the Metropolis, shall be deemed, for the purposes of Section 16 of the Royal Charter and all other purposes of the Institute, to practise in the Metropolis.

51. A Member of the Institute practising in partnership with any person not a Member of any Institute or Society of Chartered Accountants of the United Kingdom constituted by Royal Charter, under the title of a firm, shall not use after the title of that firm the initials F.C.A., or A.C.A., or describe the firm in any way whatever as Chartered Accountants.

Chapter V.-Articled Clerks.

52. Before a Member of the Institute receive a person to serve with him under Articles, he shall require of such person the production of a Certificate of the Institute to the effect that such person has passed the Preliminary Examination of the Institute or has been exempted therefrom.

58. The articles of every Articled Clerk shall, within one month after execution thereof (or within such extended period as the Council may in any case specially allow), be lodged with the Council to be registered, together with such evidence as to age as may be required.

54. If the employer of an Articled Clerk cease to practise, or cease to be a Member, or be suspended from Membership, the articles may be transferred to another Member; or in the like events, or in the event of the death of the employer, the Articled Clerk may enter into fresh articles for the remainder of his term of service.

55. Articles may be assigned by agreement between the Articled Clerk and his employer.

56. The Articled Clerk shall lodge the transfer, assignment, or fresh articles with the Council, to be registered within one month of such transfer or assignment, or of the execution of fresh articles, or within such extended period as the Council may in any case specially allow. 57. An Articled Clerk shall not be admitted to

57. An Articled Clerk shall not be admitted to the Intermediate or Final Examination unless he shall have complied with the provisions of the Bye-laws respecting registration, or the Council shall have (notwithstanding the expiration of the time limited in that behalf) allowed registration.

58. No Member shall have in his service at the same time more than two Articled Clerks; provided that in the event of the decease or "retirement from practice of any partner of a firm, any Articled Clerk or Clerks of such deceased or retiring partner may complete his or their term of service with a surviving or continuing partner, and shall not for the purposes of this Bye-law be held to be in the service of such surviving or continuing partner.

59. No person who is under sixteen years of age shall be articled to a Member of the Institute.

60. No Member shall be competent, while not in practice, or while he is suspended from Membership, or while he is a clerk to a Public Accountant, whether a Member or not, to retain or take an Articled Clerk. An Articled Clerk of a Member who has been suspended or excluded from Membership may be transferred to another Member without being counted as one of the Articled Clerks of such Member within Bye-law 58.

61. No Articled Clerk shall, during his term of service, except by the permission of the Council, engage in any other business or occupation.

62. In the event of any complaint of misconduct being made against any Articled Clerk, the matter shall be investigated by the Committee to be appointed under Bye-law 103, who shall report to the Council; and upon the report of such Committee, the Council may, with or without other evidence, at a Meeting at which there shall be present and voting not less than twelve of the Members of the Council, pass by " vote of not less than three-fourths of those present and voting a resolution to the effect that the said complaint has been proved and is of such a nature as to make the said Articled Clerk unfit to become a Member. On the passing of such resolution the articles under which he has been serving shall, for the purposes of the Royal Charter and these Bye-laws, be deemed to be at an end, and the registration of the articles " shall be cancelled; and no Member shall, except

by the permission of the Council, retain or take him as an Articled Clerk.

Chapter VI.—Examinations.

63. The Council, at their first Meeting after each Annual Meeting of the Institute, shall appoint not less than seven of their number to be the Examination Committee for the ensuing year, of whom three shall form a quorum.

64. The Committee shall have such powers and duties, in addition to the powers and duties hereby conferred, in reference to the examinations, as may be, from time to time, delegated to them by the Council; Provided that the powers and duties so delegated shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of the Royal Charter and Bye-laws.

65. The Committee, with the approval of the Council, may, from time to time, issue regulations for holding the examinations, and, under and subject to the provisions of these Bye-laws, for the conduct of the examinations.

66. The Committee, with the assistance (so far as they may think fit) of such qualified persons as the Council may from time to time nominate, shall conduct the examinations.

67. The Committee shall from its Members, or from the qualified persons nominated by the Council (as above stated), appoint Examiners, who shall, with such assistance (if any) as the Council may approve, by written papers examine the candidates, and report the results of such examination to the Committee. The Committee shall, nevertheless, have power to alter such report with reference to individual candidates as to it may seem fit. The Council may, at any time during his term of office, remove any Examiner by a resolution passed at a Meeting of the Council, at which at least twelve Members shall be present, by a majority of two-thirds of the Members voting.

68. There shall be paid out of the funds of the Institute to each Examiner for examining the candidates, such sum as the Council may from time to time determine.

69. A Member of the Council, or a Fellow of the Institute appointed by the Council, shall preside in each examination room on each day in which an examination is being held, at such remuneration as the Council shall determine.

70. Every Caudidate, at least thirty days before the examination at which he proposes to be examined, shall give written notice to the Council of his desire to be examined, and shall pay the fee payable in respect of such examination; and shall, in the case of the Intermediate and Final Examinations, leave with the Council to be registered, the certificate or evidence of service required by these Bye-laws to be so left for registration.

71. Any person who has failed to pass any examination to the satisfaction of the Committee may present himself again at any subsequent examination; save that the Committee may, in their discretion (but subject to an appeal to the Council), refuse to allow any such person so to present himself.

If after payment of his fee a candidate withdraw his name or fail to present himself for examination, no part of the fee shall be returned to him: but the Committee may allow such fee to apply to the examination at which such candidate presents himself.

72. The Committee shall report to the Council the result of each examination; and, upon the adoption by the Council of the Report of the Committee, a certificate to the effect that he has passed such examination shall, unless withheld for any reasonable cause, be issued to every person who has passed such examination to the satisfaction of the said Committee. Such certificate shall be signed by two Members of the Council, and countersigned by the Secretary.

Each candidate for an examination shall have a number assigned to him, and he shall be referred to by such number only until after the adoption by the Council of the Report of the Committee as to the result of his examination.

73. Except as provided for by Bye-law 71, every person presenting himself for any examination shall, on each occasion of his so presenting himself, pay the sum of Two Guineas as an examination fee, before he be admitted to be examined.

Preliminary Examinations.

74. Every person desirous of becoming an Articled Clerk shall, before he be articled, pass a Preliminary Examination to test his general education; save that the following persons shall be entitled to exemption from such examination:

1. Graduates of any University in the United Kingdom.

2. Persons who have passed the following Examinations, viz. :--(a.) The "Responsions" Examination at the

University of Oxford.

(b.) The "Previous" Examination at the University of Cambridge.

(c.) The Examination in Arts for the second year at the University of Durham.

(d.) The Matriculation Examination of the University of Dublin, the University of Londou, or the Victoria University of Manchester. (e.) The "Moderations" Examination at St.

David's College, Lampeter.

*(f.) The Examination for the First-class Certificate of the College of Preceptors.

*(g.) The Oxford or Cambridge Senior Local Examination.

*(h.) The Examinations for Commercial Certificates of the

Victoria University of Manchester.

London Chamber of Commerce (Higher Examination).

(i.) The Examinations by the Civil Service Commissioners for First Class Clerkships in the Home Civil Service, and for the Indian Civil Service; and the Examinations for admission to the Royal Military College at Sandhurst and the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich.

*(*j.*) The Senior and Honours Certificate Examinations of the Central Welsh Board.

*(k.) The Senior Local Examination of Durham University.

*(L) The Matriculation Examination of Birmingham University.

* Provided that, in the case of the examinations referred to in (f.) (g.) (h.) (j.) (k.) and (l.) the candidate shall have passed in the same subjects as those specified in Bye-law 77, save that in such case a candidate may substitute an additional optional subject for Elementary Latin.

Any person shall, upon satisfying the Council that he has graduated in any of the above Universities, or passed any of the above examinations, be entitled to receive a certificate to the effect that he is exempt from passing the Pre-liminary Examination of the Institute, upon payment of such fee, not exceeding one guinea, as the Council shall from time to time determine.

The Council may, by a resolution passed at a Meeting specially convened for that purpose, with notice of the object, at which meeting there Members of the Council, and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present, and voting, shall vote, resolve-

(a.) That any one or more of the examinations mentioned in this Bye-law shall no longer entitle to exemption from the Preliminary Examination; or

(b.) That any other specified examinations besides those set forth in this Bye-law shall entitle to exemption from the Preliminary Examination; Provided, nevertheless, that the first proving in this Breaker shall easily to all first proviso in this Bye-law shall apply to all examinations so added by the Council.

Provided that, notwithstanding anything in these Bye-laws, all persons who, prior to the date of these Bye-laws, shall have passed any examinations which under the then existing Bye-laws of the Institute, would have entitled them to certificates of exemption from the Preliminary Examination, shall be entitled to such certificates.

The Council may, by a resolution passed at a Meeting specially convened, with notice of the object, at which Meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four of the Members of the Council, and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote, resolve that any person, not being under thirty-five years of age, who at the date of his application shall have been for ten years continuously in service as a clerk to a Chartered Accountant, shall be exempted from the Preliminary Examination.

75. Preliminary Examinations shall be held during the first week of June, and the first week of December, and at such further or at such other times as the Council may hereafter from time to time direct.

76. Such Preliminary Examinations shall be held at the Offices of the Institute or at such other place as the Committee may from time to time appoint; and, simultaneously, should the Committee think it desirable, in the following towns or one cr more of them, and at such place or places in those towns as the Committee may decide :-

Birmingham.

Manchester.

Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

The Council may from time to time add to the above list of towns.

77. The Preliminary Examinations shall be conducted wholly in writing, in the following subjects, viz. :

1. Dictation and English Composition.

2. Arithmetic.

3. Algebra, to Quadratic Equations (inclusive).

4. Euclid (the first four books).

5. History of England and Geography.

6. Latin (Elen entary).

And also in any two of the following optional subjects, to be selected by the Candidate, one of which at least must be a language (1.) Latin; (2.) Greek (Ancient); (3.) French; (4.) German; (5.) Italian; (6.) Spanish; (7.) Higher Mathematics; (8.) Physicology; (11.) Elec-mistry; (10.) Animal Physiology; (11.) Electricity and Magnetism; (12.) Light and Heat; (13.) Geology; (14.) Stenography: Provided that the Council, by the votes of the of purchs of such Members of the Council as are present and voting at a Meeting of the Council specially convened, with notice of this object, may add to, take from, or alter such subjects.

78. At least four months before the day appointed for holding any Preliminary Examination, shall be present not less than twelve of the the Committee shall prepare a list of the books (if any) selected by them for the examination of candidates in the optional subjects, and a copy of such list shall be furnished to any person applying for the same.

79. Every candidate shall, in the notice given to the Council of his desire to be examined at the Preliminary Examination, state the two optional subjects in which he proposes to be examined under these regulations, and the town in which he wishes to be examined, together with such further information as the Council may from time to time require.

80. For the purpose of the Preliminary Examinations held out of London, the papers set by the Examiners shall be transmitted in a sealed packet to each town to the Fellow of the Institute who has been appointed to preside. The said Fellow shall open the packet in the presence of the candidates, and shall require the candidates to write from dictation, and give written answers to the papers; and the said Fellow shall, without delay, seal up and send to the Secretary the writing from dictation and the answers to the papers.

Intermediate Examinations.

81. Every Articled Clerk shall, after the expiration of one-half of the term of service prescribed by Section 12 of the Royal Charter, present himself for an Intermediate Examination to test the progress he has made in professional knowledge: Provided that if at any time the date of the Intermediate Examination be changed, with the result that an Articled Clerk, who but for such change would have been entitled to present himself for such an examination, is unable so to do by reason of not having completed one-half of the time of service aforesaid, the Committee may allow such Articled Clerk to present himself for examination notwithstanding such non-completion.

52. Every Articled Clerk presenting himself for the Intermediate Examination shall produce to the Council, to be registered, a certificate from his employer to the effect that he has duly served one half of his term of service (allowance being made in the case of illness for leave of absence not exceeding six months) and is a fit and proper person to be admitted to the Examination or, failing such certificate, shall prove the same to the satisfaction of the Council: Provided that in the event of his having been allowed to present himself under the provisions contained in the proviso to the last preceding Bye-law, the certificate or evidence as to service shall be to the effect that he has duly served such portion of his term of service as shall have elapsed.

83. The Intermediate Examination shall be held at such place or places as the Committee may from time to time appoint and at such times as the Council may from time to time direct.

84. The Intermediate Examination shall be conducted in writing, in the following subjects, viz.:--

1. Bookkeeping and Accounts (including Partnership Accounts).

2. Bookkeeping and Accounts (including Executorship Accounts).

3. Auditing.

4. The Rights and Duties of Liquidators, Trustees and Receivers.

Provided that the Council, by the votes of three-fourths of such Members of the Council as are present and voting at a Meeting of the Council specially convened, with notice of this object, may add to, take from, or alter such subjects.

Final Examinations.

85. Save as in these Bye-laws provided, every person who is not entitled under the Royal Charter or Bye-laws to be admitted without examination shall, before applying to be admitted a Member, pass the Final Examination to test his professional acquirements.

86. A person shall not present himself for the Final Examination until a period of two years has elapsed since he passed the Intermediate Examination, except that Graduates of a University, who have been articled for three years only, may present themselves for the Final Examination one year after passing the Intermediate Examination. The Committee, however, may for any reasonable cause admit any such person to be examined at any time after the expiration of his term of service: Provided that if at any time the date of the Final Examination be changed, with the result that a person who but for such change would have been entitled or allowed to present himself for such examination, is unable by reason of the period of two years aforesaid (or one year aforesaid as the case may be) not having elapsed since passing the Intermediate Examination, the Committee may, in their discretion, allow such person to present himself for examination notwithstanding that such period has not elapsed.

87. Every person who is serving or has served as an Articled Clerk shall, at the expiration of his articles and before he is admitted for Final Examination, produce to the Council to be registered a certificate from his employer, to the effect that he has duly served his term (allowance being made in the case of illness for leave of absence not exceeding six months), and is a fit and proper person to be admitted a Member of the Institute, or failing such certificate, shall prove the same to the satisfaction of the Council : Provided that if any person shall be allowed by the Council, under Section 14 of the Royal Charter, to present himself for the Final Examination within the last three months of his service the certificate or evidence as to service shall be to the effect that he has duly served such portion of his term of service as shall have elapsed.

88. The Final Examination shall be held at such place or places as the Committee may from time to time appoint, and at such times as the Council may from time to time direct.

89. The Final Examination shall be conducted in writing in the following subjects, viz :--

1. Bookkeeping and Accounts (including Partnership Accounts).

2. Bookkeeping and Accounts (including Executorship Accounts).

3. Auditing.

4. The Rights and Duties of Liquidators, Trustees, and Receivers.

5. The Principles of the Law of Bankruptcy, and of the Law relating to Joint Stock Companies.

6. The Principles of Mercantile Law, and of the Law of Arbitrations and Awards.

Provided that the Council, by the votes of three-fourths of such Members of the Council as are present and voting at a Meeting of the Council, specially convened, with notice of this object, may add to, take from, or alter such subjects.

Chapter VII.—Meetings of the Institute.

90. The Annual Meeting of the Institute for transaction of the ordinary annual business of the Institute, namely, for the election of Members of the Council and Auditors, and for the reception and adoption of the Annual Report and Accounts of the Council, with the Auditors' Report thereon, shall be held in London, or elsewhere in England or Wales on the first Wednesday in May in every year, or on such other day in May as the Council may from time to time determine.

91. The Council may, whenever they think fit, call a Special Meeting of the Institute, and shall do so within twenty-one days from the receipt by them of a requisition in writing signed by not less than forty Members and stating the object of the proposed Meeting: the notice calling the Meeting shall state the business to be transacted.

92. A Member wishing to bring before the Annual Meeting any motion, not relating to the ordinary annual business of the Institute as aforesaid, shall give notice thereof to the Council on or before the 10th of April, and no motion shall come before the Meeting unless notice thereof has been so given.

93. The Secretary shall, not less than seven or more than fourteen days before such Annual or Special Meeting of the Institute, send to each Member, at his address, as registered at the Institute, a notice mentioning the day, place, and hour of Meeting, and the business to be transacted thereat. In the case of the Annual Meeting, any motion of which notice has been given as aforesaid shall be forwarded by the Secretary to each Member, together with a copy of the Annual Report and Accounts of the Council, with the Auditors' Report thereon, and a list of the persons nominated for election as Members of the Council, or as Auditors. The non-receipt of such notice by any Member shall not invalidate the proceedings of any Meeting.

94. At all Meetings of the Institute the President of the Institute for the time being, and in his absence the Vice-President of the Institute, shall be Chairman; or, in the absence of both, the Chairman shall be elected from among the Members of the Council present; or, in the absence of all of them, then from among the Members present.

95. Unless twenty Members be present at the Annual Meeting within half-an-hour after the time appointed for the Meeting, the Meeting shaft stand adjourned for one fortnight, to be then held at the same hour and place; and unless twenty Members be present within halfan-hour after the time appointed for the adjourned Meeting, the Meeting shall be thereupon further adjourned for one fortnight, to be then held at the same hour and place, and so from time to time as often as the same shall happen until at any such Meeting there shall be a sufficient number of Members present, when the Meeting shall proceed to business and not before. At a Special Meeting, unless thirty Members be present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for the Meeting, the Meeting shall be thereupon and thereby dissolved.

96. Subject to the provisions of the foregoing Bye-laws, the Chairman of any Meeting of the Institute may, with the consent of the Meeting, adjourn the Meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned Meeting other than the business left unfinished at the Meeting from which the adjournment took place. No notice need be given of an adjourned Meeting unless it be so directed in the resolution for adjournment.

97. Every resolution and amendment proposed and seconded at a Meeting of the Institute shall be put to the Meeting by the Chairman, and decided upon by show of hands, and the declaration of the Chairman as to the majority shall be

final. On such declaration being made, a poll may be demanded in writing by at least ten Members present and entitled to vote at the Meeting; but a poll shall not be taken as to the election of Chairman, the appointment of scrutineers, or the adjournment of a Meeting.

98. On a poll being so demanded, the Chairman shall forthwith reduce the resolutions or amendments on which the poll is to be taken into the form of alternative propositions, or otherwise state the same in such a way as best to take the sense of the Members upon the substantial question or questions contained in such resolutions or amendments. Voting papers containing such propositions shall be then issued by the Council within seven days after the Meeting, and shall be returnable so as to be received by the Council within fourteen days after the Meeting.

99. The demand of a poll at a Meeting shall not prevent the transaction of any business other than that on which the poll has been demanded.

100. At every Meeting of the Institute at which a vote by voting papers is prescribed or demanded, the Meeting shall appoint five of their number as Scrutineers, any three of whom shall be competent to act.

101. The Scrutineers shall meet not less than fifteen or more than twenty-one days after the Meeting, and they or any three of them shall draw up a report of the result of the voting, stating (among other things) what voting papers have been rejected wholly or in part for nonobservance of the notes and directions thereon, or for any other and what reason. Such report shall as speedily as possible be forwarded to the Members, and the voting shall take effect from the date of the report of the Scrutineers, except in the case of a Meeting adjourned to receive the report of the Scrutineers, when the report shall be presented to such adjourned Meeting and the voting thereon take effect. Such report shall be conclusive as to the result of the voting. The Scrutineers shall reject the vote of any Member who at the date of the said Meeting is in arrear of any subscription or other sum payable by him under these Bye-laws.

102. Minutes shall be made in proper books to be provided for the purpose of all resolutions and proceedings of Meetings of the Institute; and every Minute signed by the Chairman of the Meeting to which it relates or by the Chairman of a subsequent Meeting shall be sufficient evidence of the facts therein stated.

Chapter VIII.—Exclusion or Suspension from Membership.

103. There shall be appointed in each year by the Council from among its Members a Committee consisting of not less than seven Members, any three of whom shall have power to act, for the purpose of investigating questions which may arise under Sections 19 and 20 of the Royal Charter, and of considering questions of professional practice generally, or of alleged misconduct of Articled Clerks.

104. It shall be the duty of the Secretary, and the right of any Member or of any aggrieved person, to lay before such Committee all facts brought to his knowledge which may require investigation as provided in the next preceding Bye-law.

105. If it shall be the opinion of the Committee that any question investigated by them relating to a Member of the Institute deserves further investigation, it shall be the duty of the Member

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of the Committee who is next on the list for that purpose to prefer a formal complaint to the Council or (as the case may require) to bring the matter before the Council for further investigation, and any such further steps shall be taken as shall seem good to the Council.

106. The Council upon receiving any such formal complaint, shall give such notice to the Member to whom it relates as shall afford him an opportunity of being heard before the Council. In the event of such Member desiring to be heard by Counsel or by his Solicitor, or by a Member of the Institute instead of in person, the Council may, in their discretion, grant leave to such Member to be so heard. The Council shall in any case be empowered to request a Member of the Institute, or on behalf of and at the expense of the Institute instruct Solicitors to support, or to brief Counsel to support, the formal complaint at such hearing.

107. In the event of the exclusion or suspension of a Member, the Council shall be at liberty to cause notice thereof to be published in such newspapers or journals as they may select.

108. In the event of the suspension or exclusion of a Member, every Certificate of Membership then held by him shall be delivered up by him to the Council, to be retained during his suspension, or, in the case of exclusion, to be cancelled.

Chapter IX .--- Audit.

109. The Institute, at each Annual Meeting, shall elect from among the Members two Auditors, at such remuneration, if any, as the Meeting shall determine. No Member of the Council shall be appointed an Auditor. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the office of Auditor between two annual Meetings, or in the event of a vacancy not being filled up at an Annual Meeting, the said vacancy may be filled up by the Council at a Meeting summoned with notice of the object, and a person so becoming an Auditor shall hold office only until the next Annual Meeting, but shall be eligible for reelection. Provided that during such vacancy the continuing Auditor may act alone.

110. The Auditors shall retire at the next Annual Meeting after their election, but shall be eligible for re-election.

111. The Auditors shall be nominated by two Members of the Institute, and such nomination shall be signed by the Members nominating and by the candidate, and shall be deposited at the offices of the Institute at least three days before the meeting. The Auditors who are in office shall be deemed to be nominated at each Annual Meeting unless they have signified their desire not to be re-elected.

112. The Council shall, not less than one calendar month before each Annual Meeting, deliver to the Auditors the accounts of the then last calendar year, and the Auditors shall examine such accounts and report thereon, not less than fourteen days before the date of the Meeting.

113. The Institute may at any time by a resolution passed by a majority of two-thirds of the votes of Members present and voting at a Special Meeting, remove any Auditor from his office before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by a resolution passed by a majority of the votes of Members present and voting at that Meeting, elect another qualified person in his stead; Provided that if a poll be demanded as to the resolution for removal, the same majority of two-thirds shall be necessary on the

taking of the poll for carrying that resolution. The person so elected shall hold office during such time only as the Member in whose place he was elected would have been entitled to hold the same if he had not been removed.

Chapter X.-Indemnity of Officers.

114. The Members of the Council, Auditors, Secretary, and other Officers, shall be indemnified by the Institute from all losses and expenses incurred by them in or about the discharge of their respective duties, except such as happen from their own respective wilful default.

115. No Member of the Council, Auditor, Secretary, or other Officer, shall be liable for any other Member of the Council, Auditor, Secretary, or other Officer, or for joining in any receipt or document, or for any act of conformity, or for any loss or expense happening to the Institute, unless the same happen from his own wilful default.
