Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Rule, embodying a Scheme of Examinations, framed by the Central Midwives Board in pursuance of section 3 of the Midwives Act, 1902:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that Rules so framed shall be valid only if approved by the Privy Council:

the General Medical Council with respect thereto, into consideration, are pleased to approve the Scheme of Examinations as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

SCHEDULE referred to in the foregoing Order:—  
CENTRAL MIDWIVES BOARD.  
Scheme of Examinations.

1.—Examinations.

(1.) Every Examination shall be partly oral and practical, and partly written, and shall be conducted by not fewer than two Examiners.

(2.) The first Examination shall be held in June, 1905.

(3.) Thereafter the Examination shall be held three times a year, or oftener if necessary, in London and the Provinces, simultaneously, on the same papers.

The Board reserves to itself the right to appoint one or more qualified medical practitioners as Visitors of the Examinations, both London and Provincial.

(4.) The first Provincial Centres shall be:

a. Bristol.

b. Manchester.

c. Newcastle-on-Tyne.
