The following Address was handed to His Majesty by the Mayor of Bury St. Edmunds on Saturday, the 17th December last, on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to the Borough en route for London:-

To His Majesty King Edward VII and Her Majesty Queen Alexandra.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

We, Your Majesty's loyal subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Ancient Borough of Bury St. Edmunds, gladly seize the opportunity of expressing to Your Majesty our loyalty and devotion to Your House and Person, and our satisfaction is much increased by the fact that Your Majesty is accompanied by Her Majesty the Queen.

In the centuries which have passed English

Monarchs frequently sojourned in this Town, and it will always be a proud memory to our Burgesses that at the High in Saint Edmunds Abbey were laid the foundations of our civil

rights.

Time has worked many changes since that historic date, and we are pleased in welcoming Your Majesty to recognize in Your Royal Person

a free Sovereign ruling a free people.

We earnestly pray Your Majesty may in the Providence of God be spared for many years to reign over a prosperous, happy, and contented nation.
