Notice is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her late Majesty, initialed "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that, on and after the first day of March next, Oldham below Town and Oldham above Town Sub-Districts of Oldham Registration District shall be dissolved, and their area, which is co-extensive with Oldham County Borough, shall be re-divided in the following manner into three Sub-Districts, each comprising entire Municipal Wards, viz. :---(a) A Sub-District to be called and known as Oldham East Sub-District and to consist of Waterhead, St. James, Clarksfield, and Mumps Municipal Wards; (b) a Sub-District to be called and known as Oldham Central Sub-District and to consist of St. Mary, Coldhurst, St. Peter, and Westwood Municipal Wards; and (c) a Sub-District to be called and known as Oldham South Sub-District, and to consist of Werneth, Hollinwood, St. Paul, and Hartford Municipal Wards.—Witness my hand this 9th day of February, one thousand nine hundred and five.

### Cape Hermes Light—Temporary Alteration in Visibility.

Information, dated 28th January, 1905, has been received from the Trinity House, London, that Morecambe Light-vessel, formerly situated in Grange Channel, at a distance of  $2\frac{1}{10}$  miles N. 51° W. from Middleton Tower, has been replaced by a hell buoy, exhibiting a red fixed light, moored at a distance of one cable S. 62° W. from the position of the former vessel, or  $2\frac{1}{10}$ miles N. 54° W. from Middleton Tower; this buoy is painted in black and white vertical stripes and marked "Grange Buoy."

### Santa Cruz Harbour—Shoal Reported.

#### San Fernando Point Light—Position Temporarily Altered.

The United States Government has given notice, dated 21st January, 1905, that soundings of 19 and 24 feet are reported to have been obtained in Santa Cruz Harbour, in a position from which the southern end of Hermana Mayor Island bears S. 75° W., distant  $2\frac{1}{4}$  miles, and the north-eastern point of the same island N. 51° W.

Approximate position, lat. 15°  $47\frac{1}{2}$ ' N., long. 119° 49' E.

Also, that, on 7th December, 1904, Fernando Point Light (white fixed) would be temporarily moved about 6 cables to the southward from its present position on the north-eastern extremity of the point, and re-exhibited on the edge of the cliffs on the western side of the point.

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
