

No. 122.—YELLOW SEA—PECHILI,
AND LIAU TUNG GULFS.*Pe Chili Strait—Navigation Dangerous.*

Notice is hereby given that His Majesty's Minister at Tokyo telegraphs that the Japanese Government gives warning in the Japanese Official Gazette of 29th January, 1905, of the danger to all shipping in navigating between Shantung Peninsula and Liau Tung Gulf.

*Pungue River Entrance—Additional Buoy
Established.*

Information, dated 9th January, 1905, has been received from His Britannic Majesty's Consul at the Port of Beira, that a small cylindrical buoy, painted in black and white horizontal bands, and surmounted by a cross, has been moored between Nos. 1 and 3 Buoys, Pungue River Entrance. This buoy indicates the position of a shoal with 12½ feet over it at low-water springs. Small vessels can pass on either side of this buoy, but large vessels should keep to the southward of it. A note to this effect has been placed on the Chart.

No. 125.—BALTIC—RUSSIAN SHORE.

Pake Ort, and Lyser Ort—Fog Signals Established.

The Russian Government has given notice, dated 12th January, 1905, that the fog signals described below have been established at the undermentioned lighthouses on the Russian coast:—

PAKER ORT.—A siren worked by compressed air has been established near the lighthouse; this siren will give, during thick or foggy weather, four blasts every seventy seconds, thus:—blast, two seconds; silent interval, three seconds; blast, two seconds; silent interval, three seconds; blast, two seconds; silent interval, three seconds; blast, two seconds; silent interval, fifty-three seconds.

LEVENS PATENT (NUMBER 6463 OF
1900) RELATING TO IMPROVEMENTS IN
APPLIANCES FOR PROTECTION AGAINST
PROJECTILES.

(Confirmation of Patent; Provisions for Late Payment of Fees and Granting Certificate, &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session for leave to bring in a Bill for effecting the following purposes or some of them, that is to say:—

To reinstate, continue and confirm the following Letters Patent (that is to say):—Letters Patent bearing date the sixth day of April, 1900, numbered 6463, and granted to Adolph Leven, therein described as of No. 5, Augustinerplatz Cologne, Cologne on the Rhine, in the Kingdom of Prussia, Manufacturer, for the term of fourteen years for the invention of "Improvements in Appliances for Protection against Projectiles."

To enable the holders or assignees of the said Letters Patent to pay the renewal fee or renewal fees thereon, notwithstanding that the time enlarged and limited by the Patents Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, for so doing has expired.

To enable the Comptroller-General of Patents Designs and Trade Marks to grant a certificate that the said renewal fees have been paid.

To provide that upon the granting of such certificate the said Letters Patent shall be deemed to be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes as if all the payments prescribed by the Patents Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, to be made in respect of the said Letters Patent either before or after the passing of the intended Act had been duly made or satisfied.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the office of the Clerk of the Parliaments as soon as leave shall have been given to introduce the same and in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons as soon as the Bill shall have been introduced into that House.
