**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 22ND FEBRUARY 1905.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.*

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall, subject

as herein provided, apply to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order.

*Revocation of Existing Regulations.*

2. The powers of the Local Authorities of any district comprised in the Schedule hereto to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of March, nineteen hundred and five.

**No. 134.—ADRIATIC—QUARNEROLO CHANNEL.**

*Terstenik Island Light—Particulars of Red Sector.*

The Austrian Government has given notice, dated 21st January, 1905, that Terstenik Island Light (fixed) now shows red from the bearing of N. 29° E. to N. 36° E.; the power of the light being greatest in the centre of this arc, diminishing gradually towards its limits. The light shows white in other directions.
