

HEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops' Resignation Act, 1869, a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, by Divine Providence, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury. Primate of All England and Metro-politan, at the instance of the Right Reverend

Charles John, by Divine Permission, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, and as such a Bishop of a Diocese within and of the Province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric, by reason that he is incapacitated by age and permanent physical infirmity from the due performance of his duties as Bishop:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canon-

ically resigned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the said Bishopric of Gloucester is vacant, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Gloucester.

THEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838" after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may
be separated from the parishes or mother
churches to which they belong, with great
advantage, and places altogether extra-paro-" chial may in some instances with advantage be "annexed to parishes or districts to which they "are contiguous, or be constituted separate "parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with " respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the " Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop " of any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, "place or district within the diocese of such "Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as "the case may be may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church

"and either be constituted a separate benefice | "by itself or be united to any other parish to " which it may be more conveniently annexed, or " to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, " so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or " that any extra-parochial place may with advan-"tage be annexed to any parish to which it is "contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish "for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Arch-"bishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in " writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his considera-'tion) describing the mode in which it appears "to him that the alteration may best be effected, "and how the changes consequent on such " alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-" diction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and " other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, " and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, "may be made with justice to all parties in-terested; and if the patron or patrons of the "benefice or benefices to be affected by such " alteration shall consent in writing under his or " their hands to such scheme, or to such modifi-"cation thereof as the said Archbishop may "approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full " consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any " such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall " certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, " by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an "Order for carrying such scheme, or modifica-" tion thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by section eight of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That when by any Order of " His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate " parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, "the same shall, on registration thereof, and " with the consent in writing of the Incumbent " or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to " be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy "and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly " nominated and licensed thereto, and his suc-"cessors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive " and take to himself and his successors all such " lands tenements, tithes, rent-charges and here-"ditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, "and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth " have, within the limits of the district parish "formed under the Church Building Acts, for "the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and " exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in any-" wise be subject to the controul or interference " of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice " or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he " or they shall have consented to such Order as " aforesaid."

And whereas the Right Reverend Watkin Herbert, Lord Bishop of Bangor, hath made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:

"I, Watkin Herbert, by Divine permission Bishop of Bangor, do, in pursuance of the twentysixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:

"1. There is, in the county of Carnaryon, and my diocese of Bangor, the rectory of Edern, with the ancient chapelries of Carngiwch and Pistyll, containing according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one a population of one thousand three hundred and nineteen, Edern containing four hundred and sixty-eight, and Carngiwch and Pistyll containing eight hundred and fifty-one. The gross annual value of the said benefice arising from tithe rent-charge I and Pistyll the commuted tithe rent-charge of

and other sources is three hundred and sixtythree pounds, and the net annual value is two hundred and thirty-six pounds, or thereabouts.

"2. The said chapelry of Carngiwch comprises eight hundred and seventy-six acres or thereabouts and the said chapelry of Pistyll contains three thousand four hundred and seventy-nine acres or thereabouts, the boundaries of which are well known and defined, the tithes as commuted and apportioned arising from the said chapelries amount to about one hundred and eighty-seven pounds, and both chapelries have churches (which are situated about four and six miles respectively from the parish church of Edern) with accommodation in each for one hundred persons, in which churches baptisms, churchings, marriages and burials have been performed from time immemorial. Both chapelries are separate parishes for civil purposes.

"3. There is a residence house at Edern which will continue to be the residence of the Rector

of Edern.

"4. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Acts the said chapelries of Carngiwch and Pistyll may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Edern and constituted a separate parish and benefice.

"5. The said benefice of Edern-cum-Carngiwchcum-Pistyll is in my patronage in right of my Bishopric and the Reverend John Morgan is

the present Incumbent thereof.

"6. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may best be effected, and. how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with this my consent thereto in writing as patron, and the consent in writing of the said incumbent to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the

said Bishop is as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said chapelries of Carngiwch and Pistyll with the churches belonging thereto shall be separated from the said parish of Edern and constituted a separate parish and benefice for

ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the parishioners of each of such chapelries shall be entitled to accommodation situate therein, but the church cease to be entitled to any accommodation in the parish church of Edern, except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said church of Edern, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials shall be solemnized and performed in the churches of Carngiwch and Pistyll for the inhabitants of the said respective chapelries, and fees, dues, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said chapelries shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Carngiwch-cum-Pistyll.

"That of the endowments of the said benefice of Edern there shall be transferred to Carngiwch

"That the patronage of Carngiwch-cum-Pistyll shall be vested in the Bishop of Bangor

for the time being.

"Given under my hand the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and four. " Watkin Bangor."

And whereas the said Bishop, as patron of the said benefice has consented in writing to the said scheme, and the Reverend John Morgan, the Incumbent, has signed the consent following:-

"CONSENT of the Incumbent. "I, the Reverend John Morgan, the present Incumbent of the benefice of Edern with the chapelries of Carngiwch and Pistyll, signify to your Grace my consent to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and

"John Morgan."

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and four, which said report is in the words and figures following:-

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby

report to Your Majesty in Council,
"That the Right Reverend Watkin Herbert Lord Bishop of Bangor has represented unto us (amongst other things)-

"That there is in the county of Carnarvon and his diocese of Bangor the rectory of Edern with the ancient chapelries of Carngiwch and Pistyll.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelries of Carngiwch and Pistyll may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Edern and constituted a separate parish and benefice for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the said Lord Bishop as the patron or person entitled to present in right of his Bishopric to the said benefice of Edern-cum-Carngiwch-cum-Pistyll in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend John Morgan being the present Incumbent thereof has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do relative value of the said two benefices and of

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twentyfourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fifteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words and figures following, that is to

say:—
"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage. of the benefice (being a perpetual curacy) of Christ Church-on-Needwood, situate in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield, for the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Tutbury, situate in the said county of Stafford and in the said diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Christ Church-on-Needwood, is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors in

right of Your Duchy of Lancaster.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Tutbury is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in William Arthur Hamar Bass, of Byrkley Lodge, Burton-upon-Trent, in the said county of Stafford,

Esquire.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Hood Walrond, Baronet, now Chancellor of Your Majesty's said Duchy of Lancaster, and (as such Chancellor) the person by whose signature, in accordance with the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act, the assent of Your Majesty as Patron as aforesaid of the said benefice of Christ Church-on-Needwood to the exchange hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed is to be testified as hereinafter is mentioned, and the said William Arthur Hamar Bass, as the patron of the said benefice of Tutbury as aforesaid, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Christ Church-on-Needwood and Tutbury may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the assent of Majesty, as such Patron as aforesaid (testified by the signature of the said William Hood Walrond being affixed to this scheme), and with the consent of the said William Arthur Hamar Bass (in testimony whereof he has to this scheme set his hand and seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Christ Church-on-Need-wood and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and shall become and be

absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said William Arthur Hamar Bass, his heirs and assigns, for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Tutbury and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said William Arthur Hamar Bass, his heirs and assigns and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, in right of Your said Duchy of Lancaster, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised in the same manner in all respects as the patronage of the said benefice of Christ Churchon-Needwood has heretofore been exercised.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any Act

of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when

this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

N pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows :-

i. The Northern and Salford Divisions (as defined by the Order in Council of the 4th day of May, 1864) of the County of Lancaster shall, for the purpose of the next Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of the Spring

Assize County, No. 2.
2. The said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be held at Manchester.

3. The Court at the said Spring Assizes at Manchester shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a

Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery would have had at the Assizes in the county where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, 1879, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provision of Section three of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, shall apply to the execution of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned; provided that the expression in the said section "the Sheriff of the county for which such Assizes were held " shall mean the Sheriff of the county in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, had not been passed.

4. The Sheriff of the County of Lancaster shall act for the purpose of the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County.

5. The precepts of the Judges to the said

Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of Lancaster.

6. The Gaol Delivery precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring

Assize County who under the provisions of this Order will have to be tried at Manchester, to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be brought accordingly without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

7. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs, Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either Division comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper officer thereof, any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority, and be under the same obligation to attend at the said Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper officer thereof, such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document.

8. In all indictments and presentments at the said Spring Assizes the venue laid in the margin thereof shall, in addition to the name of the county where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize

County, No. 2."

9. Any person who after the date of this Order, and before the said Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court of Oyer and Terminer or General Gaol Delivery, to be holden for either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County.

10. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence committed in either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such last-mentioned Spring Assizes or forfeit his re-

cognizance.

11. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Manchester, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County so far as the same list can then be made out, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the county of Lancaster, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement, and a notice that the persons bound by recognizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall appear and prosecute and give evidence at Manchester.

12. It shall be lawful for the Gaoler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County are appointed to be held, to send, without any writ of Habeas Corpus, such prisoners to His Majesty's Gaol at Strangeways, Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper steps for their transmission to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such Assizes, 1905.

prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, subject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law.

13. The Clerk of Assize at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses, and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the county where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoner had been tried at the Assizes held in such

last-mentioned county.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County, any Judge of the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the county or place from which he is committed or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the county or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recog-nizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding 201. to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his witnesses as may have been bound recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

14. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the county or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of Oyer and Terminer or Gaol Delivery in the county where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known agent on his behalf, shall attend the said Spring Assizes during the sitting of the Court to pay all such orders.

15. Where the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the county or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

16. Except where the context otherwise requires, terms used in this Order shall have the same meaning as that which the same terms have in the Spring Assizes Act, 1879.

17. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring Assizes, 1905.

IN pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows:

1. The North and East Riding Division and the West Riding Division (as defined by the Order in Council of the 10th day of June, 1864) of the County of York and the County of the City of York, shall, for the purpose of the next Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of the Spring Assize County, No. 3.

2. The said Spring Assizes for the said Spring

Assize County shall be held at Leeds.

3. The Court at the said Spring Assizes at Leeds shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery would have had at the Assizes in the county where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provision of Section three of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, shall apply to the execution of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned; provided that the expression in the said Section "the Sheriff of the County for which such Assizes were held" shall mean the Sheriff of the County in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, had not been passed.

4. The Sheriff of the County of York shall alone act for the purpose of the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and subject to the provisions of this Order shall have jurisdiction for that purpose over the whole district constituting the said Spring Assize County, and precepts and other documents relating to the said Spring Assizes shall be addressed to him

alone.

5. The Gaol Delivery precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of York; and the Jurors so summoned shall be deemed to be good and lawful men of the body of the several counties constituting the said Spring Assize County; and the Grand and Petty Jury formed out of those Jurors shall be deemed to be a Grand and Petty Jury respectively of the body of the said Counties respectively, and shall have

jurisdiction accordingly.

6. The precepts of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring Assize County who under the provisions of this Order will have to be tried at Leeds, to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be, brought accordingly without any writ of Habeas

Corpus.

7. In all matters not before specifically mentioned the precepts to the said Sheriff shall direct him to issue, and he shall issue the like notices, precepts, warrants, and documents, and perform the same acts (mutatis mutandis) as if he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, and all Under Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Constables, Officers in the said Spring Assize County shall obey accordingly.

8. The said Sheriff shall, as to all matters in relation to such Spring Assizes for which no specific provision is made by this Order, have the same power, jurisdiction, and responsibility as if

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th | he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, except that this provision shall not authorize the said Sheriff to carry sentences into execution outside the county of York, or to levy outside the said County fines imposed or recognizances estreated at the said Spring Assizes.

9. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs, Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either of the Counties comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize or the proper officer thereof any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority, and be under the same obligation to attend at the said Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper officer thereof, such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document. This provision shall not apply to the Sheriff of the County of the City of York.

10. In all indictments and presentments at the said Spring Assizes, the venue laid in the margin thereof shall, in addition to the name of the county where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize

County, No. 3."

11. Any person who after the date of this Order and before the said Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court of Oyer and Terminer or General Gaol Delivery, to be holden for any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at the said Spring Assizes for the said. Spring Assize County.

12. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence committed in any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such last-mentioned Spring Assizes, or forfeit his recognizance.

13. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Leeds, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, so far as the same list can then be made out, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the County of York, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement, and a notice that the persons bound by recognizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall appear and prosecute and give evidence at Leeds.

14. It shall be lawful for the Gaoler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County are appointed to be held, to send, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus, such prisoners to His Majesty's Gaol at Leeds for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper steps for their transmission to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way, and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, stibject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law.

15. The Clerk of Assize at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses, and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the county where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoner had been tried at the Assizes held in such

last-mentioned county.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County, any Judge of the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the county or place from which he is committed or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the county or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recognizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding 20L, to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his witnesses as may have been bound by recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

16. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the county or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of Oyer and Terminer or Gaol Delivery in the county where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known agent on his behalf, shall attend the said Spring Assizes during the sitting of the Court to pay all such orders.

17. Where the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the county or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

18. Except where the context otherwise requires, terms used in this Order shall have the same meaning as that which the same terms have in the Spring Assizes Act, 1879.

19. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring Assizes, 1905.
