#### TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Thursday, the 23rd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,220,000, in part replacement of Bills falling due on the 28th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 28th March, 1905, and will be payable at six months after date, viz. :—on the 28th September, 1905.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Friday, the 24th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Tuesday, the 28th instant.

All that piece or parcel of land comprising three roods and twenty perches or thereabouts, situate in the parish of Croydon, in the county of Surrey, bounded on the east side by Stanhope-road, on the north side by a public footpath known as Fairfield path, on the west side partly by the end of a public road and partly by the Public Recreation Ground, and on the south side by land belonging to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, all which said firstly-mentioned piece or parcel of land, together with the house and buildings erected thereon, is more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured red.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a piece or parcel of land comprising one acre, or thereabouts, which has been permanently secured as a site for a new parsonage or house of residence for the vicarage of Llandilo Fawr, in the county of Carmarthen, and in the diocese of Saint David's, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Llandilo Fawr, to meet such benefaction, one capital sum of four hundred pounds, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a new parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Llandilo Fawr.
