DECLARATION,

Requiring all Officers and Soldiers to observe strict Discipline, and for Payment of Quarters.

O the end Our Forces may be kept in good Order and Discipline, and Our Subjects not suffer by any Disorders or Misbehaviour of any Officers and Soldiers within our Pay and Entertainment, We have thought fit hereby to declare Our Royal Will have thought fit hereby to declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That in what place soever any of Our Forces shall pass or remain, they shall duly pay their Quarters according to the Instructions We have given them for that purpose, which faid instructions We have Commanded the Colonel or Officer in Chief with any Regiment, Troop or Company, to Communicate and Publish to the Chief Magistrate of the City, Townor Village where he is or shall be Quartered, and all to all others who shall be concerned, as soon as he Marches into the same, beyond which no Officer or Private Soldin is to be Trusted on any Account or Preture mouths as

ches into the same, beyond which no Officer or Private Soldier is to be Trusted on any Account or Pretence what sever, in their said Quarters. And whereas We have already Charged and Required the Officers of Our Army to make or casse Satisfaction to be made for all Injuries already dwe by Themselves, or Soldiers under their Command, upturely Insulated all Our said Officers and Soldiers to use any Violence or Threatning Words to any Person what soever, or give any Offence or just Cause of Complaint.

And incase any of Our Said Officers or Soldiers shall presame to Commit any Soul or Disorder, or use any Violence or Threatning Words, or otherwise Niebehave themselves, We do hereby surther Declare, That besides the ordinary Cearse of Justice for Redress, if the persons egricued shall make known the same to the Superiour Officers, the Said Officers shall, and are hereby Required to cause Satisfaction in immediately to be made; and that it such Officers to whom Complaint is made, shall sorbear or Delay the causing due Satisfaction to be given, as aforesaid, the Person to whom Wrong is done, are to make their surther Complaint to any two Tusties of the Present Complaint to any two Tusties of the December Complaints of the Person of the Person Complaint to any two Tusties of the Person whom Complaint is made, shall Torbear or Delay the caufing due Satisfaction to be given, as aforesaid, the Person to whom Wrong is done, are to make their further Complaint to any two Justices of the Peace of the County, City, or Place where the Offence is Committed, which said Justices We do Require to represent the sum forthwith to Us, that We may order speedy Justice the come by Reparation of the Injury, and causing the Officers and soldiers for offending, to be Punished as the Nature and Quality of item Offences shall deserve. And We do sum Private House March or Quarters shall be Lodged in any Private House March or Quarters shall be Lodged in any Private House whatsoever, without the Free and Voluntary Consent of the Owner, and that in case any Officers or Soldiers shall for any Reward or Consideration, Leave or Change the Quarters appointed them, or shall Demand or Exast Money for Quarters, or to Exemps any Person from the same, they shall be Punished by Cashieving and loss of their Pay. And We do likewise strictly Prohibit and Forbid all Officers and Soldiers to Destroy or Disturb the Game in any manner whatsoever, without Leave from Us, the Lords of the refusitive Mannors, or others to whom it may belong to grantife same, it being Our Royal Intention and Command, that a Officers and Soldiers in Our Service behave themselves Orderly in all things, according to Law and Military Discusses of Our High Displeasure.

The Marquis de Conflans parted from hence the last week, to command the Spanish Forces in Catalonia, and so soon as he arrives there, they will enter upon Action.

Warfaw, June 17. We have an Account from the Frontiers, That a great Body of Tarters have lately fallen into the Province of Vollmin, and made a terrible Desolation, burning the Countrey, and carrying away with them a great number of People and Cattle. They write from Lemberg, That 6000 Turks and Walachians liave betteged Sorocke on the Neister, in which we have a Garison of about 800 Men. Vienna, June 19. The last Letters from the Imperial Camp near Great Waradin are of the 10th instant, and say, That General Heisterhald put a Garison of 2000 Men into that place, where they found 60 Pieces of Cannon, besides divers that were broke and unstruceable; That several thousand Men were daily employed to demolish the Works they had made during the Siege, and to repair the Fortifications of the Forties; and that the Garison which came out of it, was put into the New Fort, built by the Imperialists the last Winter, and would probably be obliged to remain there till the General had an Account whether the Turks have kept the Capitulation with our Men that lately quitted the Cave of Pescabara.
