A DECLARATION, Requiring all Officers and Soldiers to observe strict Discipline, and for Payment of Quarters.

TO the end Our Forces may be kept in good Order and Discipline, and Our Subjects not suffer by any Disorders or Misbehaviour of any Officers and Soldiers within our Pay and Entertainment, We have thought fit hereby to declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That in what place soever any of Our Forces shall pass or remain, they shall duly pay their Quarters according to the Instructions We have given them for that purpose; which said Instructions We have Commanded the Colonel or Officer in Chief with any Regiment, Troop or Company, to communicate and Publish to the Chief Magistrate of the City, Town or Village where he is or shall be Quartered, and also to all others who shall be concerned, as soon as he Marches into the same, beyond which no Officer or Private Soldier is to be Trusted on any Account or Pretence whatsoever, in their said Quarters. And whereas We have already Charged and Required the Officers of Our Army to make or cause Satisfaction to be made for all Injuries already done by themselves, or Soldiers under their Command, upon Pain of Our heavy Displeasure; So We do for the future strictly Forbid all Our said Officers and Soldiers to use any Violence or Threatning Words to any Person whatsoever, or give any Offence or just Cause of Complaint.

And in case any of Our said Officers or Soldiers shall presume to Commit any Spoil or Disorder, or use any Violence or Threatning Words, or otherwise Misbehave themselves, We do hereby further Declare, That besides the ordinary Course of Justice for Redress, if the persons grieved shall make known the same to the Superiour Officers, the said Officers shall, and are hereby Required to cause Satisfaction immediately to be made; and that if such Officers to whom Complaint is made, shall forbear or Delay the causing due Satisfaction to be given, as aforesaid, the Person to whom Wrong is done, are to make their further Complaint to any two Justices of the Peace of the County, City, or Place where the Offence is Committed, which said Justices We do Require to represent the same forthwith to Us, that We may order speedy Justice to be done by Reparation of the Injury, and causing the Officers and Soldiers so offending, to be Punished as the Nature and Quality of their Offences shall deserve. And We do further Declare Our Will and Pleasure to be, That no Officer or Soldier in their March or Quarters shall be Lodged in any Private House whatsoever, without the Free and Voluntary Consent of the Owner, and that in case any Officers or Soldiers shall for any Reward or Consideration, Leave or Change the Quarters appointed them, or shall Demand or Exact Money for Quarters, or to Exempt any Person from the same, they shall be Punished by Casting and loss of their Pay. And We do likewise strictly Prohibit and Forbid all Officers and Soldiers to Destroy or Disturb the Game in any manner whatsoever, without Leave from Us, the Lords of the respective Mannors, or others to whom it may belong to grant the same, it being Our Royal Intention and Command, That all Officers and Soldiers in Our Service behave themselves orderly in all things, according to Law and Military Discipline, as becomes them, upon Pain of the severest Consequences of Our High Displeasure.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall, the Twen'y Third day of June, 1692. In the Fourth year of Our Reign.

Milan, June 11. The Forces of this State are marched, with a Train of Artilley, and a great quantity of Ammunition, and several thousand Bombs, to the Camp near *Vigon*, where we reckon the whole Army will be together by the 15th of this month. Monsieur *Catinat* is come nearer to *Pignero*, with the French Forces under his Command, and by our last Advice was posted at *Villarda*, within a mile or two of that place.

Madrid, June 11. The Court is returned hither from *Araguez*. We hear, that Directions have been sent to the Marquis de *Gastanaga*, who arrived lately in *Biscaye*, to come to *Burgos*, and to remain there till he receives farther Orders; and that three of the Council of State are in the mean time appointed to examine his Conduct and Administration of Affairs during his Government of the Spanish Netherlands. The Gallies of *Naples* and *Sicily* are arrived at *Barcelona*, in order to joyn with the Spanish Fleet, which is going to Sea under the Command of Don *Pedro de Corbette*. The Marquis de *Comfians* parted from hence the last week, to command the Spanish Forces in *Catalonia*; and so soon as he arrives there, they will enter upon Action.

Warsaw, June 17. We have an Account from the Frontiers, That a great Body of Tatars have lately fallen into the Province of *Volhynia*, and made a terrible Defolation, burning the Countrey, and carrying away with them a great number of People and Cattle. They write from *Lemberg*, That 6000 Turks and Walachians have beteged *Sorocke* on the *Neister*, in which we have a Garison of about 800 Men. The Forces of this Crown are moving towards their Rendezvous; tho' they march but slowly, because there is not yet Forage enough in the Field for the Horse to draw into a Body.

Vienna, June 19. The last Letters from the Imperial Camp near *Great Waradin* are of the 10th instant, and say, That General *Heister* had put a Garison of 2000 Men into that place, where they found 60 Pieces of Cannon, besides divers that were broke and unserviceable; That several thousand Men were daily employed to demolish the Works they had made during the Siege, and to repair the Fortifications of the Fortres; and that the Garison which came out of it, was put into the New Fort, built by the Imperialists the last Winter, and would probably be obliged to remain there till the General had an Account whether the Turks have kept the Capitulation with our Men that lately quitted the Cave of *Pescabara*. The last Advices from *Turkey* say, That *Ali Basia*, who was sent for from *Mesopotamia* to be made Grand Visier, was come to *Arianople*; That the first thing he did, after having entered upon that station, was to depose the Mufti, and the other Creatures of his Predecessor; and that he intended to set out towards *Belgrade* about the beginning of July. The Imperial Forces have their Rendezvous between *Buda* and *Mohaz*. The Croats have lately made an Incurtion into the Enemies Country, and brought back 200 Head of Cattle, and divers Prisoners.

Francofort, June 25. The Troops of *Franconia* and *Suabia*, with the other Considerate Forces who drew together about *Smitzheim*, are since come to *Wiseloch*, and intend, as we are informed, to move farther this way, in order to joyn with those of *Hesse*, who are removed from *Hochst* to *Hochkeym*. The Landgrave himself is now at *Dieburg*, about 3 miles from hence, with the Margrave of *Bareith*, Velt Marshall General, and the Count de *Strum*, where they have held several Conferences of War. The French Army, commanded by the Marschal de *Lorges*, is marched from *Neder Ulm* towards *Genzingen* and *Critzsnach*, in order, as 'ris said, to reinforce the Garisons of *Landau* and *Philipsburg*.
