PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, situate partly in the county of Carmarthen and partly in the county of Glamorgan and wholly in the diocese of Saint David's, and of the new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, situate in the said county of Carmarthen and in the said diocese of Saint David's.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the second day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the following December, a consolidated chapelry district was assigned to the consecrated church called Christ Church at Cwmamman in the parish

of Llandilo Fawr, in the said county of Carmarthen, and the said consolidated chapelry district was named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry District of Christ Church, Cwmamman.’

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and published in the London Gazette on the twelfth day of the same month, a district chapelry was assigned to the Church of Saint Catherine situate at Brynamman within the said cure of Christ Church, Cwmamman, and the said district chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Catherine, Brynamman.’

“And whereas the said consolidated chapelry district of Christ Church, Cwmamman, and the said district chapelry of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, and of the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the

boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, and of the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing

Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, situate partly in the county of Carmarthen and partly in the county of Glamorgan and wholly in the diocese of Saint David's, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, in the said county of Carmarthen and in the said diocese of Saint David's, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, upon the south-east by the parish of Llangiwig otherwise Llangwicke, in the said county of Glamorgan and in the said diocese of Saint David's, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the road leading from the Rhiw-fawr Sunday School past the houses called Pen-rhiw-fawr, Blaennant and Bwlch-bryn-du to Gwaun-Cae-Gurwen Colliery leaves the enclosed land of Hendre Forgan Farm and enters the unenclosed land of the mountain called the Mynydd Uchaf of Penllerfedwen, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llangiwig otherwise Llangwicke from the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of one mile and sixteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the footpath leading from the house called Pen-coedcae-bach along the slope called Tyle-penlan and across the stream flowing from above the house called Bwlch-bryn-du towards Gwaun-Cae-Gurwen Colliery, and extending thence north-westward and in a straight line across the plateau called Gwaun-Cae-Gurwen for a distance of one mile and forty chains or thereabouts to the southern corner of the close numbered 49 upon the ordnance map of the parish of Llangiwig otherwise Llangwicke published in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight upon the scale of twenty-five inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this scheme or representation, and extending thence northward along the fences forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 49 and of the close numbered 52 upon the said maps for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the south-eastern side of Parkstreet in the village called Lower Brynamman, and extending thence northward across Parkstreet for a distance of nine yards or thereabouts to the fence which divides the close numbered 56 upon the said maps from the close numbered 57 upon the said maps and extending thence north-

ward along the last described fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 54 upon the said maps, and extending thence due northward and in a straight line across the said close numbered 54 across the strip of land upon the left bank of the River Aman numbered 55 upon the said maps and half-way across the said river for a distance in all of one chain and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said River Aman and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said River Aman for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 1303 upon the ordnance map of the parish of Llandilo Fawr published in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight upon the scale of twenty-five inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this scheme or representation from the strip of plantation land numbered 1253 upon the same maps and extending thence north-westward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 1303 and the closes numbered 1308 (including the house called Cornel-fach) 1307 and 1252 upon the last-mentioned maps from the said strip of plantation land numbered 1253 for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 1252 from the said strip of plantation land numbered 1253 meets the fence forming the southern boundary of the road leading from Brynamman past the house called Pen-waun-ynys towards Cwmamman, and extending thence due north across the last-mentioned road for a distance of twenty yards or thereabouts to a point in the fence which divides such road from the close numbered 1210 upon the last-mentioned maps and extending thence north-westward along the fences which divide the said last-mentioned road and the closes numbered 1208 and 1209 upon the last-mentioned maps from the said close numbered 1210 and the closes numbered 1211 and 1214 upon the last-mentioned maps for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 1208 from the said close numbered 1214 meets the fence on the south side of the stream called Nant Gwineu, and extending thence northward and in a straight line across the said stream and up the southern slope of the mountain called Foel-deg-ar-bedol for a distance of sixty chains or thereabouts to the cairn at the summit of such mountain upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, from the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patron and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838" after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by section eight of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That when by any Order of His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent in writing of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and

"exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the controul or interference of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Right Reverend Arthur Thomas, Lord Bishop of Newcastle, hath represented in a writing, dated the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and four, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple, Lord Archbishop of York, as follows:—

"I, the Right Reverend Arthur Thomas, Lord Bishop of Newcastle, do hereby represent to your Grace, that there is in the county of Northumberland within my diocese the vicarage of Woodhorn, the parish whereof comprises amongst other places the townships of North Seaton and Hirst. Portions of these townships are more particularly defined in the schedule hereunder written and on the plan attached to the scheme hereunder written and coloured round with a red verge line and are hereinafter referred to as the said proposed new parish of Seaton Hirst.

"That the population of the said parish of Woodhorn is estimated to be thirteen thousand.

"That the population of the said proposed new parish of Seaton Hirst is estimated to be ten thousand five hundred.

"That there is a consecrated church dedicated to Saint John, situate within the said proposed new parish of Seaton Hirst, convenient for the use of the inhabitants thereof.

"That the net annual value of the said benefice of Woodhorn is three hundred and eighty pounds.

"That the patronage of the said benefice of Woodhorn being a vicarage, is vested in me as Bishop of Newcastle, and the Reverend Obadiah Rhodes is the Incumbent thereof.

"That the Incumbent of the said benefice consents to the scheme hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to us that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the sessions held in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six, and the second and third years of the same reign, chapter forty-nine, portions of the said townships of North Seaton and Hirst may advantageously be detached from the said parish of Woodhorn and constituted a separate parish and benefice for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me the separation above proposed may be best effected and how the change consequent upon such separation may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do submit the same to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may, if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed that such portions of the townships of North Seaton and Hirst, in the parish of Woodhorn and diocese of Newcastle, as are coloured round with red on the plan attached hereto and more particularly defined in the schedule hereunder written, shall be severed from

the said parish of Woodhorn to which they now belong, and be constituted a separate benefice and a parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the name or style of the parish or benefice of Seaton Hirst, of which the said Church, situate within the said township of Hirst, shall be the parish church.

"That the vicar of Woodhorn shall cease to have cure of souls within the said proposed parish or benefice of Seaton Hirst, and that the inhabitants of the said proposed parish or benefice of Seaton Hirst shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the parish church of Woodhorn or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected within that parish.

"That the said proposed parish or benefice of Seaton Hirst shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said benefice of Woodhorn, and that the incumbent of the said proposed parish or benefice shall have exclusive charge of souls within the limits of the same.

"That two churchwardens shall be chosen annually in the accustomed manner and at the time when churchwardens are usually appointed in or for such proposed parish or benefice, and every person so appointed shall be duly admitted and shall do all things pertaining to the office of churchwarden as to ecclesiastical matters within the said proposed parish or benefice.

"That baptisms, churchings, marriages and burials shall be performed in the church of the said proposed parish or benefice, and all fees and payments for the same and other ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice as shall arise therein, shall henceforth belong and be paid to the incumbent of the said proposed parish or benefice of Seaton Hirst (with the exception of the fees chargeable for permission to erect head stones which shall be paid as heretofore to the present vicar of Woodhorn during his incumbency only after which they shall be paid to the incumbent of the proposed new parish).

"That the parishioners of the said proposed parish or benefice shall not be entitled to any accommodation in the parish church of Woodhorn.

"That the patronage or right of nomination of a minister to serve the proposed parish or benefice of Seaton Hirst shall be vested in the said Arthur Thomas, Lord Bishop of Newcastle and his successors Lord Bishops of Newcastle for ever.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowment arising from glebe lands, tithes or rent-charges belonging to the benefice of Woodhorn.

"That no alteration shall be made as to the patronage of the said benefice of Woodhorn.

"The SCHEDULE above referred to.

"All those portions of the townships of North Seaton and Hirst, situate in the parish of Woodhorn, in the county of Northumberland and diocese of Newcastle, which are bounded as follows:—On the east by the boundary line separating the parish of Ashington from that of Woodhorn, starting from the centre of the River Wansbeck, running north and terminating where the said line intersects the Newbiggin branch of the North Eastern Railway; on the north by the Newbiggin branch of the North Eastern Railway from the point of its intersection by the boundary line between the parishes of Woodhorn and Ashington aforesaid, to the road leading past the west of Woodhorn Colliery houses; on the west by the road leading from Woodhorn Colliery houses to North Seaton Moor House Farm, from

thence by the bridge path or highway until it joins the public highway leading from North Seaton Station, from thence by the last-mentioned public highway until it is joined by the road leading to North Seaton Colliery, from thence by the last-mentioned Colliery road to the northern side of the field commonly known as the 'Colliery Field,' from thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the 'Colliery Field'; on the south by a line running down the centre of the River Wansbeck.

"All which portions of the townships of North Seaton and Hirst are more particularly delineated on the plan accompanying this scheme and distinguished thereon by being coloured round with a red verge line.

"CONSENTS.

"I, the Right Reverend Arthur Thomas, Lord Bishop of Newcastle, patron of the said Parish Church of Woodhorn, do hereby signify to your Grace my consent to the foregoing representation and scheme.

"As witness my hand this thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and four.

"Arthur T. Newcastle.

"I, Obadiah Rhodes, Vicar of the said Parish of Woodhorn, do hereby signify to your Grace my consent to the foregoing representation and scheme.

"As witness my hand this fourteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five.

"O. Rhodes."

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five, which said report is in the words and figures following:—

"We the undersigned, William Dalrymple by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York, do certify to Your Majesty in Council

"That the Right Reverend Arthur Thomas, Lord Bishop of Newcastle within our Province of York, has represented to us that there is in the county of Northumberland within his Lordship's diocese of Newcastle the vicarage of Woodhorn, the parish whereof comprises amongst other places the townships of North Seaton and Hirst. Portions of these townships are more particularly stated in the schedule hereto annexed and are defined on the plan attached hereto and coloured round with a red verge line and are referred to as the said proposed new parish of Seaton Hirst.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop, that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the sessions held in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six, and the second and third years of the same reign, chapter forty-nine, the portions of the said townships of North Seaton and Hirst as defined on the said plan, may advantageously be detached from the said parish of Woodhorn and constituted a separate parish and benefice for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a representation and scheme in writing and has transmitted the same to us for our consideration describing the mode in which it appears to him that the separation may be best effected with justice to all parties.

"That the patronage of the said vicarage of Woodhorn is vested in the said Lord Bishop of Newcastle.

"That the said Lord Bishop as Patron and the Reverend Obadiah Rhodes, as Incumbent of the said Parish Church of Woodhorn, are consenting parties to the scheme hereinafter proposed.

"That the representation of the said Lord Bishop together with the scheme in writing and the consents of the Patron and Incumbent are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme do hereby certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

Now therefore His Majesty in Council by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said scheme be carried into effect.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Nicholas, North Newbald, in the East Riding of the county of York, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, made a

representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the civil parish of North Newbald without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parish as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the tenth day of February last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said civil parish without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parish shall be discontinued as follows, viz. :—

NORTH NEWBALD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Nicholas, in the said parish; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

In the earthen graves now existing in the portion of the churchyard which was added in one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and belonging or reputed to belong to Mr. G. H. Levitts, Mr. R. Tindale, Mr. C. England, and Mrs. Flint, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

THE EDMONTON POOR LAW UNION AND
THE HACKNEY POOR LAW UNION.

Notice is hereby given, that the Committee of the Privy Council under the London Government

Act, 1899, have settled a Scheme of Financial Adjustment between the Guardians of the Edmonton Union and the Guardians of the Hackney Union, in connection with the transfer under the Act of the Parish of South Hornsey from the Edmonton Union to the Hackney Union. Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish shall submit to Us for Our approval a Statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse at the said Workhouse, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to such Nurses, and We approve such Statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the said Order of a person to hold the office of Nurse in the said Workhouse, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any such person, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said Statement and approved by Us:

Provided as follows:—

- (1.) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any Superintendent Nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.
- (2.) A person who has not reached the age of twenty-one years shall not be employed in the capacity of Probationary Nurse.
