boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, and of the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of

Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing

Scheme or Representation has reference. "The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, situate partly in the county of Carmarthen and partly in the county of Glamorgan and wholly in the diocese of Saint David's, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, in the said county of Carmarthen and in the said

diocese of Saint David's, being:—
"All that portion of the said new parish of

Christ Church, Cwmamman, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman, upon the southeast by the parish of Llangiwg otherwise Llanguicke, in the said county of Glamorgan and in the said diocese of Saint David's, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the road leading from the Rhiw-fawr Sunday School past the houses called Pen-rhiw-fawr, Blaennant and Bwlch-bryn-du to Gwaun-Cae-Gurwen Colliery leaves the enclosed land of Hendre Forgan Farm and enters the unenclosed land of the mountain called the Mynydd Uchaf of Penllerfedwen, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llangiwg otherwise Llanguicke from the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of one mile and sixteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the footpath leading from the house called Pen-coedcae-bach along the slope called Tyle-penian and across the stream flowing from above the house called Bwlch-bryn-du towards Gwaun-Cae-Gurwen Colliery, and extending thence north-westward and in a straight line across the plateau called Gwaun-Cae-Gurwen for a distance of one mile and forty chains or thereabouts to the southern corner of the close numbered 49 upon the ordnance map of the parish of Llangiwg otherwise Llanguicke published in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight upon the scale of twenty-five inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this scheme or representation, and extending thence northward along the fences forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 49 and of the close numbered 52 upon the said maps for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the south-eastern side of Parkstreet in the village called Lower Brynamman, and extending thence northward across Parkstreet for a distance of nine yards or thereabouts to the fence which divides the close numbered 56 upon the said maps from the close numbered 57 upon the said maps and extending thence northward along the last described fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 54 upon the said maps, and extending thence due northward and in a straight line across the said close numbered 54 across the strip of land upon the left bank of the River Aman numbered 55 upon the said maps and half-way across the said river for a distance in all of one chain and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said River Aman and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said River Aman for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 1303 upon the ordnance map of the parish of Llandilo Fawr published in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight upon the scale of twenty-five inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this scheme or representation from the strip of plantation land numbered 1253 upon the same maps and extending thence northwestward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 1303 and the closes numbered 1308 (including the house called Cornel-fach) 1307 and 1252 upon the last-mentioned maps from the said strip of plantation land numbered 1253 for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 1252 from the said strip of plantation land numbered 1253 meets the fence forming the southern boundary of the road leading from Brynamman past the house called Pen-waun-ynys towards Cwmamman, and extending thence due north across the last-mentioned road for a distance of twenty yards or thereabouts to a point in the fence which divides such road from the close numbered 1210 upon the last-mentioned maps and extending thence north-westward along the fences which divide the said last-mentioned road and the closes numbered 1208 and 1209 upon the last-mentioned maps from the said close numbered 1210 and the closes numbered 1211 and 1214 upon the lastmentioned maps for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 1208 from the said close numbered 1214 meets the fence on the south side of the stream called Nant Gwineu, and extending thence northward and in a straight line across the said stream and up the southern slope of the mountain called Foel-deg-ar-bedol for a distance of sixty chains or thereabouts to the cairn at the summit of such mountain upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Cwmamman, from the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Brynamman."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patron and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.
