Whereas it is desirable to make provision for the delivery from Premises licensed for the manufacture of Tobacco by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Inland Revenue for transmission by Parcel Post to places out of the United Kingdom, of such goods as the said Commissioners may from time to time allow. We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred upon us by the 14th section of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by their respectively signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

(1.) The Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1885, shall not apply to parcels of goods, delivered from Premises licensed for the manufacture of Tobacco by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Inland Revenue, hereinafter referred to as "bouded parcels."

(2.) Every bonded parcel delivered from Premises licensed for the manufacture of Tobacco by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Inland Revenue to the sender shall be accompanied by an authority for such delivery signed by an officer of Inland Revenue.

(3.) The Officer of the Post Office accepting a bonded parcel duly accompanied by the Inland Revenue authority shall give to the sender a certificate of the posting of the parcel.

(4.) The certificate of posting thus given shall, for the purposes of section 104 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, relating to the exportation of bonded goods, be deemed to be evidence of an act equivalent to shipment under that section.

(5.) The delivery of bonded parcels from Premises licensed for the manufacture of Tobacco by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Inland Revenue shall be subject to such bond and to such special conditions as the said Commissioners may from time to time prescribe.

(6.) If any claim shall be made on the Postmaster-General for compensation in respect of the loss of or damage to any bonded parcel, that claim shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be deemed to be conclusive evidence that such parcel has not been duly exported, and that its contents have gone into consumption in the United Kingdom, and any drawback paid shall be

repaid by the Tobacco Manufacturer.
(7.) This Warrant shall come into operation on

the first day of April, 1905.
(8.) This Warrant may be cited as the "Foreign Parcels (Inland Revenue) Warrant, 1905."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 22 and 28, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

- Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served;
- (ii.) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomaury, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers, may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay;
- (iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years—
 - (A) In any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,
 - . (B) In the Royal Irish Constabulary, or
 - (C) As Registered Boy Clerks in connection with the Civil Service,

may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

II. Candidates will be required to show what technical education and preliminary training they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must show (1) that they have served for at least two years in a public or private office under a Civil Engineer, Architect, or Surveyor, (2) that the works on which they have been engaged during those years were such as to afford them the opportunity of gaining a satisfactory knowledge of their profession; and (3) that they have fully profited by their practical training, and possess the necessary qualifications and experience. Evidence on these points must be sent in at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If such evidence should prove prima facie satisfactory, the Caudidate will be admitted to examination, subject, in the case of his being successful in the competition, to such further inquiry, and the production of such further evidence as may be necessary.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- 1. English Composition (including Hand-writing and Orthography).
- 2. Arithmetic.

- 3. Land Surveying, including Draughtsmanship and the making and plotting of Surveys; and either
- 4. Architectural Surveying and Valuing; or
- 5. Practical Farming, including the elements of Geology and Chemistry as applied to Agriculture, and Land Valuing.

In subjects 3, 4, and 5 there will be an Oral and Practical Examination.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in subjects numbered 1, 2, 3, and must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the Examination, as a whole, as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency.

- IV. Subject to the provisions of Clause II of these regulations the examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalized British subjects, being of the requisite age, health, and character, with the following restrictions:—
 - (i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible, viz.:—
 - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army or Navy.
 - (h) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.
 - (ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—
 - (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.
 - (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.
 - (e) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.
 - (f) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense.
 - (g) Persons who have been trained in the Inland Revenue Branch of the Government Laboratory.
 - Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of the competition.
 - Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
 - Persons comprised in class (g) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent of the Board of Inland Revenue, given with the like sanction, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- V. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.
- VI. A fee of £3 will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

GENERAL ORDER: Altering Regulations as to Payments on behalf of Guardians:—
SALFORD UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Article 84 of a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union, amongst others, and hereinafter referred to as "the General Consolidated Order," the Poor Law Commissioners directed that the Guardians should pay every sum greater than Five Pounds by an order drawn upon their Treasurer and signed by the presiding Chairman and two other Guardians at a meeting, and countersigned by the Clerk;

And whereas by Article 16 of a General Order dated the 14th day of January, 1867, addressed to the Guardians of the said Union, amongst others, and hereinafter referred to as "the General Accounts Order," the Poor Law Board directed that the Clerk to the Guardians should keep a Book of Account termed the Petty Cash Book;

And whereas it is expedient that, so far as regards the Salford Union, provision should be made for assigning to an Assistant Clerk, in substitution for the Clerk to the Guardians, certain duties with respect to the receipt and disbursement of moneys on behalf of the Guardians:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, by this Our Order, Direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union shall from time to time by a resolution designate an Assistant Clerk (hereinafter referred to as "the Assistant Clerk") by whom the duties prescribed by this Order shall be discharged.

(2.) The Assistant Clerk shall, in substitution for the Clerk to the Guardians, while the resolution by which he is designated remains in force, discharge the duties prescribed by this Order, and be accountable for the due application of all moneys from time to time received by him from the Guardians for the purposes of this Order.

the Guardians for the purposes of this Order.

ARTICLE II.—(1.) The Assistant Clerk shall keep a Petty Cash Book, in which shall be entered

promptly, and in the order of date, an account of the moneys received by him for the aforesaid purposes, and of the sums paid by him thereout in accordance with this Order, whether by direction of the Guardians or on his own authority in any case of urgency.

(2.) The said account shall be balanced quarterly, and laid before the Guardians at their ordinary meetings, and the Assistant Clerk shall submit and account for the same to the Auditor at the time of the audit, and the said account shall accordingly be an account to which such of the provisions of the General Accounts Order as relate to the examination and closing of accounts and the auditing of accounts shall apply.

and the auditing of accounts shall apply.

ARTICLE III.—The moneys which the Guardians from time to time entrust to the Assistant Clerk for the purposes of this Order shall be of an amount which, in the opinion of the Guardians, will suffice for every such petty disbursement on their behalf as will not exceed the sum of Five Pounds and for every such payment in respect of the salary or other remuneration of an officer, assistant, or servant of the Guardians as will not exceed the sum of Ten Pounds, and as in either case will need to be made within such period as the Guardians fix.

ARTICLE IV.—(1.) While this Order is in force with regard to the payment of any salary or other remuneration by the Guardians to any of their officers, assistants, or servants, Article 84 of the General Consolidated Order shall, in relation to the Salford Union, have effect as if the words "Ten Pounds" were substituted in the said Article for the words "Five Pounds."

(2.) While this Order is in force, so much of Article 16 of the General Accounts Order as relates to the Petty Cash Book and the duties of the Clerk with respect to that Account shall cease to apply and have effect with respect to the Salford Union.

- 10. The Lessees to be entitled, and subject to the rights and obligations of the Lessors relating to the tramway under the said Order and the Tramways Act, 1870.
