The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Quarantine Proclamation which has been issued by the Governor of Louisiana:—

Quarantine Proclamation for the year 1905.

Published by the Louisiana State Board of Health.

State of Louisiana,
 Executive Department.

At the request of the Board of Health of the State of Louisiana, embodied in a resolution adopted by that body at a regular meeting, held February 23, 1905, and by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, I, Newton C. Blanchard, Governor of Louisiana, do hereby issue this, my proclamation, to take effect on and after the first day of April, 1905 (all vessels arriving at the mouth of the Mississippi River after six o'clock P.M., March 31st, 1905, to be included).

That all vessels arriving at the several quarantine stations of Louisiana, together with their cargoes, crews, passengers, and baggage, shall be subjected to inspection and sanitation according to the following schedule:

First Class.—Vessels which are not included in the following classes shall be subjected to necessary maritime sanitation without detention of either vessels or persons longer than may be necessary to place such vessel in good sanitary condition.

Second Class.—Vessels arriving from Suspected Ports (Intertropical American and West Indian and Brazilian ports) which, in the absence of satisfactory information to the contrary, are considered suspicious, and other ports which may be decided suspicious by the Board of Health, shall be subjected to full sanitation at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station, together with detention of the vessel and persons for such length of time as the Board of Health may determine.

Third Class.—Vessels arriving from ports known to be infected shall be subjected to full sanitation at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station and shall be detained for observation together with their crews, cargoes, and passengers, for such length of time after completion of disinfection as the Board of Health may determine.

Fourth Class.—Vessels, which without regard to Ports of Departure, are infected, that is to say, vessels which have yellow fever, cholera, or other contagious or infectious diseases on board at the time of arrival, or have had same on voyage, shall proceed at once to the Lazaretto to land their sick, and they shall proceed to the Mississippi River Quarantine Station there to undergo thorough disinfection and be detained, together with passengers, crews, and cargoes, for such length of time as the Board of Health may determine.

Vessels arriving from ports known or suspected to be infected with cholera, or bubonic plague, shall be subjected to maritime sanitation and such detention as the Board of Health may determine.

Vessels arriving from ports and places belonging to the second, third, and fourth classes, as set forth in the above schedules, shall not be allowed to pass the Rigolets, Lake Borgne Canal, Atchafalaya, or Calcasieu Quarantine Stations, or other Quarantine Stations which may be hereafter established, without having undergone proper maritime sanitation at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station.

Vessels engaged in the Tropical Fruit Trade, whose sanitary condition and health record are satisfactory, may be allowed to pass the Mississippi River Quarantine Station after inspection under such regulations and sanitary treatment as the Board of Health may prescribe.

Quarantine Officers at the several Stations of this State are especially charged and required to strictly enforce the articles of this proclamation.

The State Board of Health is requested to prosecute vigorously all violators of the same, as well as of the Quarantine Laws and Regulations of this State.

Resolution adopted April 24th, 1895, and still in force.

Hereafter full quarantine restrictions will be imposed on all vessels whose officers wilfully attempt deception in regard to any case of sickness, or material capable of carrying infection, or wilfully disregard the rules and regulations of the Board of Health; and such detention will be imposed thereafter on every vessel on which any officer who has previously attempted to practice deception is found in any official capacity.

Special Instructions to Owners, Agents, Masters of Vessels, and Passengers.

The Louisiana State Board of Health recommends the following suggestions to agents, owners, masters of vessels, and passengers, for the purpose of facilitating the work of quarantine officers and reducing the period of detention to a minimum.

1. That vessels should be stripped during the quarantine seasons of all woollen hangings, carpets, curtains, and such like materials, and upholstered furniture as far as practicable. Hair or moss mattresses to be replaced by wire or wicker beds.

2. That, as far as possible, vessels trading with tropical ports should be manned with acclimated crews.

3. Drinking water for use on vessels should not be taken from rivers or streams in Inter-Tropical countries.

4. Masters of vessels, ship and consular agents, are earnestly requested to instruct passengers from quarantinable ports to dispense, as far as possible, with baggage which may be injured by sulphur fumigation. Such risk of injury must be assumed by the owners of baggage.

5. While in ports infected with yellow fever, vessels should be anchored out in the harbour, when this is possible, and the crew prohibited from going ashore, especially at night. All on board should sleep under mosquito bars, and after leaving the infected port all mosquitoes on board should be destroyed. This can be done by burning sulphur for a few hours in each saloon, stateroom, fore-castle, or other closed places (not the holds, if the ship has cargo).

6. When practicable, cargoes should be loaded in such a manner as to allow access to the pumps, and also to enable the quarantine officers to pump out and wash the bilge.

7. For the purpose of avoiding delay and expense at quarantine, owing to the necessity of shifting of cargo for the object of disinfection, it is recommended that there be constructed in all vessels from quarantined ports an open framework shaft, fifteen inches in diameter, from the centre of each hatch, through which the fumigating pipe may be introduced down to the dunnage of the vessel.

8. Special attention should be given to cleanliness of vessels and persons, and provision should be made for all possible ventilation of the entire vessel. Instruction for using disinfectants can be obtained by application to the Board of Health or Quarantine officers.

9. Masters should, before arrival, see that the bilge is thoroughly pumped out and cleansed, and that the entire vessel be put in such good sanitary condition as to permit of the least possible detention. Fruit vessels particularly should be kept thoroughly cleansed for the purpose of avoiding delay at the Quarantine Station.

10. Vessels observing the above recommendations will receive special consideration at the Quarantine Station, detention for the purpose of cleansing, disinfecting, &c., being materially lessened thereby.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall, subject as herein provided, apply to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Revocation of Existing Regulations.

2. The powers of the Local Authorities of any district comprised in the Schedule hereto to

make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and five.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF

**BURTON-UPON-TRENT (SWINE-FEVER)
ORDER OF 1905.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Movement of Swine out of Borough of Burton-upon-Trent.

1.—(1.) No swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent except as expressly authorised by this Order.

(2.) Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through that borough by railway from a place outside that borough to another place outside that borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that borough.

*Swine to be Moved out of Borough only for
Immediate Slaughter.*

2.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place) may be moved out of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse if accompanied by a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of that borough and on the following conditions (namely) :

(i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved, by railway so far as is practicable, to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article.

(iii.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted and the name or description of the bacon factory or slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.

(iv.) The Local Authority of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent shall cause a copy of the Movement Licence to be sent forthwith to the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are to be moved.

(v.) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(vi.) The Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence and are duly slaughtered there.

(2.) Swine moved under this Article shall not, unless otherwise hereafter expressly provided by

Order of the Board, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by any other Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine.

3. No market fair sale or exhibition of swine, fat or store, shall be held in the borough of Burton-upon-Trent except as expressly authorised by this Order.

Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

4.—(1.) An exhibition of swine may be held in the borough with a Licence of the Local Authority, on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.

(2.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, by such Licence authorise the sale at such exhibition of the swine exhibited thereat on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.

(3.) The Local Authority shall not grant a Licence for an exhibition under this Article unless they are satisfied that the proposed exhibition is a bona fide agricultural show, and that the swine are to be exhibited thereat for competition.

Sale of Swine with Licence of Local Authority in cases where the Swine have been on Premises for 28 days.

5.—(1.) A sale of swine may be held in the borough with a Licence of the Local Authority in any case where the sale is held in accordance with the following conditions (namely)—

- (i.) that the sale is held on a farm or premises not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place; and
- (ii.) that no pig on the said farm or premises is affected with swine-fever; and
- (iii.) that each pig exposed at the sale has been on the said farm or premises for a period of not less than twenty-eight days immediately before the day on which the sale is held; and

(iv.) that during that period no pig has been brought on to the said farm or premises, and that no pig on the said farm or premises has during that period in any way been exposed to the infection of swine-fever.

(2.) A Licence of the Local Authority for a sale under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall give notice of the conditions contained in this Article by specifying the same as conditions on which the Licence is granted, and may impose such further conditions, if any, as the Local Authority think expedient, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the sale, and shall also specify the farm or premises where and the date when the sale is to be held, and the Local Authority may at any time revoke any such Licence.

(3.) The Licence for a sale under this Article or a copy of such Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such sale by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the farm or premises where such sale is held.

Markets Fairs and Sales of Fat Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) A market fair or sale of swine may be held in the borough with a Licence of the Local Authority provided that the swine exposed at a market fair or sale authorised under this Article shall be moved from the market, fair, or sale only

if accompanied by a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority authorising movement to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence and subject to all the conditions of Article 2 (1) of this Order so far as the same are applicable.

(2.) A Licence of the Local Authority for a market fair or sale under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall give notice of the conditions contained in this Article by specifying the same as conditions on which the Licence is granted, and may impose such further conditions, if any, as the Local Authority think expedient, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair or sale (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair or sale is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs or sales on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding one month, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time, and shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same, and the Local Authority may at any time revoke any such Licence.

(3.) The Licence for a market fair or sale under this Article or a copy of such Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair or sale by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market, fair-ground, or sale-yard where such market fair or sale is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall grant a Licence for a market fair or sale under this Article only if they are satisfied that the market fair or sale is to be held in a market, fair-ground, or sale-yard which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.

Copies of Licences for Markets &c. to be sent to Board.

7. The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

8. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence of the Local Authority for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Attendance at Markets Fairs and Sales.

9. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market or fair licensed under this Order and at every sale licensed under Article 6 of this Order, and a fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority to attend at every market, fair, or sale so licensed, for the purpose of granting thereat on behalf of the Local Authority such Movement Licences as are required under this Order.

Limitation on Granting of Movement Licences.

10. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the swine, or exposing the swine

for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting or licensed to hold the market fair or sale at which the swine are exposed, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of the Local Authority.

Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.

11.—(1.) Every person in charge of a pig or thing being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a market fair sale or exhibition is held in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the person licensed to hold or holding the same, and the occupier of the place or farm or premises where the market fair sale or exhibition is held, and the owner or consignee of each pig exposed or exhibited thereat, and the person exposing or exhibiting the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any pig, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market fair sale or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the purchaser thereof, and the person licensed to hold or holding the market fair sale or exhibition, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof,

shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on :

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered :

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board :

“Farm or premises” includes two or more adjoining farms or premises in the same occupation :

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector :

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries :

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

14. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked as from the date of commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and five.

Short Title.

16. This Order may be cited as the BURTON-UPON-TRENT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1905.

THE BRISTOL TRAMWAYS AND CARRIAGE COMPANY LIMITED.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Bristol Tramways and Carriage Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company"). Under and by virtue of powers conferred on the Company by "The Bristol Tramways Acts, 1872 to 1904," and the Acts incorporated therewith.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. In these Bye-laws the word "Conductor" shall mean and include any Inspector, Driver, Conductor, or other Officer of the Company.

3. Except by the direction of the conductor no person shall enter or depart from a carriage otherwise than by the step of the hindmost platform. All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon, shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette inside any carriage. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be

liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter mentioned, to be summarily removed from the carriage.

5. No person shall while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and any such person who shall be found in or upon any carriage may be immediately removed from such carriage by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or behave offensively whilst in or upon any carriage, waiting room or other premises used in connection with the tramways, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, waiting room or premises, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or upon any carriage, or place his feet upon or lie upon any seat, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

9. No person whose clothing or personal condition might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure any carriage, or the linings or cushions thereof, or the clothing of any passenger, or who in the opinion of the conductor might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and any such person may be prevented from entering in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter in or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed from the carriage.

10. No person suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall enter or mount upon any carriage, nor shall any clothing, bedding, or other articles likely to spread any contagious or infectious disease be placed by any person upon any carriage.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

12. Each passenger shall retain the ticket (if any) delivered to him on payment of his fare and shall show the same when required so to do to the conductor, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

13. Any ticket issued by the Company in respect of a fare shall be available only for the carriage on or for which it is issued, and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any carriage for any purpose whatever at any stage and resume his journey by such carriage or by a different carriage from that on or for which such ticket was issued except upon payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger re-entered such carriage or entered the second or other carriage.

14. No passenger not being a person belonging to the labouring class within the true intent and meaning of the Company's Acts of Parliament or

Orders, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for persons belonging to the labouring class.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of persons belonging to the labouring class) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in or upon any other part of any carriage.

16. No person, other than an officer or servant of the Company, shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof thereof, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting, shall immediately on request of the conductor cease so to do.

17. No person, other than a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter into or mount upon any carriage, or shall hold or hang on by or to or be upon any part of any carriage.

18.—(a) Except as hereinafter expressly provided whenever and so long as the interior of any car used upon the tramways of the Company is occupied by not less than the number of passengers for whom accommodation is stated in the notice attached to or painted on such car to be provided in such interior, no additional person (other than the conductor of such car or any other duly authorized officer or servant of the Company) shall enter or remain or be in such interior. Provided that during inclement weather or on Sundays or Bank or other public holidays throughout the day, or on Saturdays after 12 o'clock noon or (with the consent of the Corporation under the hand of the Town Clerk) on special occasions, any number of passengers (not exceeding 6) in excess of the number stated as aforesaid may with the express permission in each case of the conductor of the car first obtained stand in such part of the interior of such car as the said conductor may direct.

(b) Except as hereinafter expressly provided, whenever and so long as the exterior of any car used upon the tramways of the Company is occupied by not less than the number of passengers for whom accommodation is stated in the notice attached to or painted on such car, to be provided on such exterior, no additional person (other than the conductor of the car, or any other duly authorized officer or servant of the Company), shall mount or remain, or be on such exterior (including the platforms and stairways of the car). Provided that any passenger or two passengers (but not more) in excess of the number stated as aforesaid, may with the express permission in each case of the conductor of the car first obtained, sit upon such part of such exterior as the said conductor may direct, but except for the purpose of going to or coming from any seat on such exterior no person (other than the conductor of the car or any other duly authorized officer or servant of the Company), shall stand upon any part of such exterior.

19. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

20. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods or merchandise of any sort, or distribute any advertisements, pamphlets, or any other literature in or upon any carriage.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or upon any carriage in breach

of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the carriage immediately upon the request of the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall travel in or upon any carriage with loaded firearms, or gunpowder, or other explosive materials.

23. No unauthorized person shall interfere in any way with the electrical equipment or other mechanical apparatus of any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done to such electrical equipment or other mechanical apparatus.

24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

26. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

27. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of June, 1905, and as from that date the existing Bye-laws and Regulations of the Company, which came into force on the 11th day of August, 1877, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

NOTICE is hereby given, that at a Meeting of the above named Council, held at the Council Offices, Bexleyheath, in the county of Kent, on the 15th day of March, 1905, the following Bye-laws and Regulations were made and sealed by the Council under the powers conferred upon them by the Bexley Tramways Act 1901, the Tramways Act, 1870, and all other Acts having reference thereto and incorporated therewith, for regulating the travelling in or upon any carriage belonging to the Council:—

I. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Council and to all places with respect to which the Council have power to make Bye laws or Regulations.

II. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

III. No passenger or other person shall, while

travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

IV. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage, shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

V. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or spit in or upon any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

VI. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings or remove or deface any number, plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

VII. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

VIII. Every passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Council the fare legally demandable for the journey, and a ticket corresponding thereto shall be delivered to such passenger by the conductor, and such passenger shall accept and retain such ticket, until demanded previous to or at the end of the journey.

IX. Every passenger shall show his ticket (if any) to the conductor, or any duly authorized officer of the Council, when required by him so to do. Any passenger failing or refusing to accept or retain or to show his ticket as aforesaid shall be required to pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger, and, in default of showing such ticket, or of payment of such fare, shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws.

X. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Bexley Council Tramways, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

XI. Personal and other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front, or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

XII. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Council shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platform of any carriage or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage.

XIII. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or without the consent of the conductor travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers,

XIV. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or upon any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

XV. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

XVI. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, or mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

XVII. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or upon any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, or other duly authorized servant of the Council.

XVIII. No person shall travel in or upon any carriage of the Council with loaded firearms.

XIX. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Council.

XX. No passenger shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes either inside or on the platform of any carriage, nor on that part of the top of a car which may be reserved for non-smokers.

XXI. No person shall pull or sound the signal bells provided for use by the Council's servants, or handle or otherwise interfere with the controller, brakes, trolley pole, wires, or other electric or working gear of the carriage, or of the electric equipment of the tramways.

XXII. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws or Regulations to the best of his ability.

XXIII. The expression "Conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employ of the Council and having charge of a carriage.

XXIV. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

XXV. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws is liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

The provisions of the Summary Jurisdiction Acts, with respect to the recovery of penalties, are applicable to the penalties for breach of these Regulations or Bye-laws.

XXVI. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 31st day of May, 1905.
