## No. 330.—ENGLAND—EAST COAST, RIVER THAMES.

*Sea Reach—Positions of Buoys Altered.*

*Chapman Light—Limit of Sector Altered.*

With reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 376 and 605 of 1904, and Nos. 90 and 237 of 1905:—

The Trinity House, London, has given further notice, dated 11th April, 1905, that the position of the undermentioned buoys has been altered to mark the centre of the deep water channel through Sea Reach, River Thames, instead of the northern side of that channel as heretofore:—

1. The red pillar light-buoy, marked No. 2, exhibiting a white occulting light every ten seconds, has been moved S. 15° W. about 170 yards from its former position, and is now moored in a depth of 28 feet at a distance of 14 cables S. 6° E. from Southend Pier light.

2. The red pillar light-buoy, marked No. 3, exhibiting a white group flashing light, showing two flashes in quick succession every ten seconds, has been moved S. 15° W. about 150 yards from its former position, and is now moored in a depth of 29 feet at a distance of 15 cables N. 44° E. from Yantlet Beacon.

3. The red pillar light-buoy, marked No. 4, exhibiting a white occulting light every ten seconds, has been moved S. 30° E. about 170 yards from its former position, and is now moored in a depth of 27 feet at a distance of 16 cables N. 4° W. from Yantlet Beacon.

Also, that the position of the undermentioned buoys has been altered as follows:—

a. East River Middle buoy (spherical black and white horizontal bands) has been moved 6 cables N. 51° W., and is now moored in a depth of 25 feet at a distance of 5½ cables S. 25° W. from Southend Pierhead.

b. River Middle buoy (black conical) has been moved 3½ cables N. 46° W., and is now moored in a depth of 25 feet at a distance of 12½ cables S. 82° W. from Southend Pierhead.

c. West River Middle buoy (black conical) has been moored 3½ cables N. 45° W. from its former position, and is now moored in a depth of 26 feet at a distance of 1½ miles S. 73° E. from Chapman Lighthouse.

The dividing line between the red and the white sectors shown from Chapman Light (group occulting) has been altered from the bearing of N. 69° W. to N. 72° W.

Approximate position, lat. 51° 30' N., long. 0° 37' E.

## No. 331.—BALTIC—GERMANY, FLENSBURG FIORD.

*Kekenis (Keke Ness) Light—Sectors Altered.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 194 of 1905:—

The German Government has given further notice, dated 8th April, 1905, that the character of the sectors of Keke Ness Light (white) have been altered as follows:—

The light now shows groups of three flashes every thirteen seconds from the bearing of S. 50° W., through west, to N. 75° W., the duration of each flash being one and seven-tenths of a second, fixed from N. 75° W. to N. 58° W., group flashing showing groups of four flashes every thirteen seconds, the duration of each flash being one and four-tenths of a second, from N. 58° W. to N. 11° W., group flashing showing groups of two flashes every ten seconds, the duration of each flash being one and three-quarter seconds from N. 11° W., through north, to N. 87° E., fixed from N. 87° E., through east, to S. 88° E., group flashing showing groups of three flashes every ten seconds from S. 88° E. to S. 66° E., the duration of each flash being one and three-tenths of a second. The light is obscured in other directions.

Approximate position, lat. 54° 50' N., long. 10° 0' E.
