No. 385.—BAHAMAS—ANDROS ISLAND,  
EAST COAST.

*Nicols Town—Light Established.*

Information has been received from the Board of Trade, that on 27th March, 1905, a white fixed light, elevated 67 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles was established in a skeleton steel tower, 25 feet high, painted grey, erected on the east coast of Andros Island, about 7 cables to the southward of Nicols Town.

Approximate position, lat. 25° 8' N., long. 78° 0' W.

This light being local, and not under official observation, must be considered as unwatched.

No. 386.—BALTIC ENTRANCE—THE  
KATTEGAT.

*Skagen Light—Intended Alterations In.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 566 of 1904:—

The Danish Government has given further notice, dated 19th April, 1905, that on June 1st the white fixed light at present exhibited on the Skagen or Skaw will be replaced by a provisional white occulting light, showing about forty eclipses every minute; it will be placed in the upper gallery of the lighthouse at an elevation of 138 feet above high water, and be visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles. The light will be obscured between the bearings of S. 79° E., through east, and N. 11° E. The new light (white flashing every two and a half seconds) may be exhibited experimentally whilst the provisional light is shown.
