An Area comprising such parts of the administrative county of Cumberland as lie within the following boundary, namely:—

#### TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 22nd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 27th and 28th instant.
