The Locomotives Act, 1898.

Sulina Branch—Signals Indicating Least Depth In.

The European Commission of the Danube has given notice, dated 14th May, 1905, that when sudden changes occur in the least depths of water in the Sulina branch, the amount will be indicated by black balls hoisted on the flagstuffs of the Inspectorates at Tulcha, Chatal de St. George, Gorgova, and Chamourli, each ball representing a decrease in depth of 3 inches, thus :—one ball, 3 inches; two balls, 6 inches, and so on.

Morlaix—Rocks in Approach.

1. A rock, which uncovers 2 feet to the northward of Les Cochons Noirs, situated in a position from which the western head (dries 26 feet) of Les Cochons Noirs bears S. 76° W., distant seven-tenths of a cable, and La Vieille Tower S. 47° E.

No. 542.—CHINA SEA—PALAWAN, EAST COAST.

Port Princesa (Royalist)—Decreased Depth on Shoal, Buoy Established.

The United States Government has given notice, dated 27th May, 1905, that an examination of the rock, situated at a distance of 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ cables N. 55° W. from Saboruco, or Tide Pole Point, shows that the depth over it is less than 9 feet, and not 4 fathoms as shown on the Chart.
