POST OFFICE TELEGRAPHS.

NOTICE AS TO COUNTING OF TELEGRAMS.

The Postmaster-General hereby gives notice, in pursuance of the power vested in him by the Telegraph (Inland Written Telegram) Regulations, 1898, that the rules specified in Regulation 24 of the said Regulations have been varied by him as follows (that is to say):—

(1.) With reference to the names of places (paragraph 1 (b) of the said Regulation), the name of a town or village and of a county in the address of a telegram will be counted as one word, when the addition of the name of the county is necessary to distinguish the town or village from some other place of the same name.

Thus: the words Sutton (Cambs) and Sutton (Yorks) will in each case be counted as one word.

(2.) With reference to combinations of figures and letters (paragraph 1 (k) of the said Regulation), a combination of figures and letters in the address of a telegram, when denoting the number of a house, will be counted as though the letters were figures.

Thus: 104 A, A 5, will be counted as four figures and two figures respectively, i.e., as one word in each case.

BOROUGH OF BARROW-IN-FURNESS.

The Tramways Act, 1870. Section 46.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, acting by the Council as the Local Authority of the said borough, with respect to the Barrow-in-Furness Tramways under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, have made the following Bye-laws and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any car or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car or carriage.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than ten yards.

3. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 2 and 4, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers at any stopping place approved from time to time by the Council, and indicated by a notice affixed to a tramway or lamp post, or when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car or by persons desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, at such stopping places as are indicated by a notice to the effect that "cars stop here if required."

4. Except at a passing place or terminus or at stopping places approved by the Council, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

5. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle, standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall with reasonable despatch cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

6. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

7. A copy of these Bye-laws shall be carried on every car, and the conductor shall, on request of any passenger, produce the same to and shall permit the same to be perused by such passenger.

8. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

9. The Bye-laws and Regulations, dated the 17th day of September, 1887, made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, acting by the Council as the Local Authority of the said borough, under the powers conferred by the Tramways Act, 1870, shall from and after the date of the allowance of these Bye-laws be repealed.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of October, 1905.

1. All vessels, except those belonging to the Japanese Imperial Navy, are prohibited from entering or leaving Wonsan Bay between sunset and sunrise without special permission from the Commander of the port.

2. Vessels entering or leaving must keep southward of an imaginary line joining the south-western point of Nikolskago Island, and the southern extremity of Sho Shin to (Bretel Island).

3. The speed of vessels is not to exceed 5 knots when navigating within the area westward of imaginary lines joining Black Rock (northward of Nakhi Mova Peninsula), to the north point of Kuprianova Island and the eastern extremity of Nikolskago Island, and from thence to Kodrika Point. Wonsan Harbour limit extends in a S. 70° W. direction from the western extremity of Muraveva Point to a point on the coast about $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables N. 52° W. from the red light at Khosui Ri.

4. Except the Commander of the port considers it necessary to enforce them, the regulations in paragraphs Nos. 2 and 3 do not apply to vessels under 20 tons displacement, cargo boats, or boats belonging to the Naval or Military Departments, or boats under special permission from the Commander of the port.

5. Any vessels infringing these regulations are liable to meet with an accident, and to be fired upon at night.

A picket boat will be kept to guide vessels into port.
