And we do by these Presents authorize and empower you to hold sittings if and so far as you think necessary out of the United Kingdom:

And we do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH JUNE 1905.)

LINCOLN AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER)
PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER
OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the Lincoin and District (Swine-Fever) Prohibition of Movement Order of 1905.

LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL (TRAMWAYS)
BILL.

(Alteration of Works.)

OTICE is hereby given, that during the progress of the above Bill through the House of Commons (in which Honourable House the Bill originated), provision has been made for certain alterations of the line or situation of Tramways Nos. 1, 1A, and 2, as originally proposed to be authorised by the Bill as introduced into Parliament. Such alterations are as follows, namely:—

(1.) The construction of so much of the said Tramway No. 1 as will be situate in Westminster Bridge-road, and on Westminster Bridge, and the approaches thereto, and the Victoria Embankment, in such a position as to be adjacent to the kerb of the footway on the northern side of the said road, bridge, and approaches, and the eastern or south-eastern side of the said Embankment, instead of in the position in the roadway shown on the Plans deposited in the month of November last, in respect of the said Bill, with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of London (hereinafter referred to as "the November Plans"), such alteration commencing at or near the point of commencement of the said tramway as shown on the November Plans, and terminating on the Victoria Embankment, at a point 1½ chains or thereabouts westward of the western side of Waterloo Bridge, and being in

the parish and metropolitan borough of Lambeth, and the parishes of St. Margaret, Westminster, St. Martin-in-the-Fields, and St. Clement Danes, and the precinct of the Savoy, in the City of Westminster.

- (2.) The construction of the said Tramway No. 1a, in the centre of Stangate, and extending so as to form a junction with the before-mentioned portion of Tramway No. 1 (as intended to be altered) on the eastern approach to Westminster Bridge, such alteration commencing at or near the point of commencement of the said Tramway No. 1a, as shown on the November Plans and terminating by the aforesaid junction, at a point 2 chains or thereabouts westward of the junction of Belvedere-road with Westminster Bridgeroad, and being wholly in the parish and metropolitan borough of Lambeth.
- (3.) The construction of so much of the said Tramway No. 2 as will be situate between a point 1½ chains or thereabouts westward of the western side of Waterloo Bridge, and a point 1½ chains or thereabouts westward of the north-western corner of Blackfriars Bridge, in such a position as to be adjacent to the kerb of the footway on the southern side of the Victoria Embankment, instead of in the position in the roadway shown on the November Plans, such alteration being in the Precinct of the Savoy and the parishes of St. Mary-le-Strand and St. Clement Danes, in the City of Westminster, and the extra parochial places of the Inner Temple and Middle Temple, the Precinct of Whitefriars, the parish of St. Bride, and the Precinct of Bridewell, in the City of London.

The London County Council (the promoters of the said Bill) accordingly intend, if the said Bill becomes law, to construct the said Tramway and portions of Tramways in such altered line or situation.

No. 584.—WEST INDIES—JAMAICA.

Port Royal Approaches—Intended Alterations in Beacons and Buoys.

Information, dated 26th May, 1905, has been received from the Harbour Master at Kingston, that in about six months' time the following alterations will be made in the buoys and beacons in the approaches to Port Royal:—

EAST CHANNEL

- 1. Gun Cay. The conical buoy, painted in red and white vertical stripes, situated about one cable to the northward of this cay, will be withdrawn; and the beacon on the cay from which the red light is exhibited will be painted red.
- 2. Maiden Cay. The beacon, painted in red and white vertical stripes, on this cay will be removed.
- 3. Beacon Shoal. The old beacon on this shoal will be removed, but the beacon from which the light is exhibited will remain.

Approximate position, lat. 17° $55\frac{1}{2}$ ′ N., long. 76° $50\frac{1}{4}$ ′ W.

SOUTH CHANNEL.

Portuguese Shoal. The red conical buoy surmounted by a ball, now situated on the leading line, will be moved to the western edge of the shoal about three-quarters of a cable N. 78° E. from its present position.
