

thence north-westerly along that lane to its termination at the main road, thence south-westerly along the main road by Little Blacksticks to Birch-lane, thence southerly along Birch-lane, thence westerly along the road to Barns-lane, thence south-westerly along Barns-lane to its termination at Barns-lane Bottom, thence south-westerly along the road by Stony-lane Farm and Syke House to the guide-post near Beesley House, thence westerly and north-westerly along the road through Inglewhite to Carron-lane, thence north-westerly along that lane and by the road past Spaddock Hall to the bridge over the Preston and Lancaster Branch of the London and North Western Railway, thence northerly along the eastern side of that railway to Bay Horse Station, thence north-easterly along the road by Five Lane Ends, the Dog and Partridge Public-house and St. Peter's Church, Quernmore, to Postern Gate-road, thence northerly along that road to its termination at Postern Gate Lodge, thence north-easterly along the road skirting South Park by Collier Gate Farm to Forge Bridge over the Artle Beck, thence northerly along the course of that Beck to the north-western branch of the Midland Railway, thence easterly along the southern side of that railway to where it crosses the river Ribble near Runley Bridge Farm, thence south-easterly and south-westerly along the course of that river to the point of commencement.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 8th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,000,000, viz., £1,800,000 in replacement of Bills falling due on the 13th instant, and £200,000 in further part replacement of Bills paid off on the 13th May.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 12th August, 1905, and will be payable at six months after date, viz. :—on the 12th February, 1906.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
