(SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, with modifications, to certain Scheduled Districts.*

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall apply to the Districts specified in the Schedule hereto, (in this

Order referred to as Scheduled Districts,) as if they had been declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

*Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by  
Licence of Local Authority.*

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in a Scheduled District, if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

(3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.

(5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

*Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.*

3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in

the Licence is in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

*Licences after Completion of Movement.*

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

*Attendance at Markets, &c.*

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

*Revocation by Board of Licences.*

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Forms.*

9. For the purposes of any Movement Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order, the Scheduled Districts shall be deemed to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

*Offences.*

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is

necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

11. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Area” means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

12. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of August, nineteen hundred and five.

*Short Title.*

13. This Order may be cited as the LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF KESTEVEN) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1905.

ORDER of the Local Government Board : Motor Car Act, 1903 : Regulations under Section 8 :—  
BOROUGH OF KINGSTON-UPON-THAMES.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames ;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, prohibit the driving of any motor cars or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous ;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections prohibiting the driving of motor cars on a certain highway situate within the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the



Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, do hereby, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car on the highway within the Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames, which consists of the street known as Bank Lane.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and five.

And whereas by Article 153 of the said Order provision was made for the appointment by the said Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in any Workhouse of the Union, including the office of Nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of that Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of Nurse at any Workhouse of the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a Statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse at any Workhouse of the said Union, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to those Nurses, and We approve the Statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the said Order of a person to hold the office of Nurse in that Workhouse, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any person so appointed, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons

and the scale of salaries shown in the said Statement and approved by Us:

Provided as follows:—

- (1.) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any Superintendent Nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.
- (2.) A person who has not reached the age of twenty-one years shall not be employed in the capacity of Probationary Nurse.

### THE URBAN DISTRICT OF LEES.

#### LEES TRAMWAYS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Lees, in pursuance of the Tramways Act, 1870, did on Wednesday, the nineteenth day of July, 1905, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations, and copies of the same were on the twenty-first day of July, 1905, laid before the Board of Trade for their sanction and approval:—

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Urban District Council of Lees, in the county of Lancaster, as the Local Authority under section 45 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

The Urban District Council of Lees, in the county of Lancaster, acting by the Council as the Local Authority for the said District under the "Tramways Act, 1870," do hereby, with respect to the tramways laid down within the said District and in pursuance of the power for that purpose contained in the said Act, make the Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter contained as to the following matters, viz.:—

The stopping of carriages using the tramway.

The traffic on the road in which the tramway is laid.

(1) For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said District, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car, and the term "person" shall include any body of persons, whether corporate or unincorporate.

(2) Every driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers at each of the stopping places for the time being fixed for the purpose by the said Urban District Council when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car or by any person desirous of travelling by the car for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made.

(3) The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than ten yards.

(4) The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

(5) No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

(6) Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Numbers 4 and 5, the drivers of all heavy and slow travelling vehicles shall keep such vehicles to the extreme left hand or near side of the road along which they are travelling.

(7) Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

(8) These Bye-laws shall come into force on the twenty-third day of October, 1905.
