ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH AUGUST 1905.)

WEYMOUTH AND DISTRICT (SWINE- FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows

a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the WEYMOUTH AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1905.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulation under Section 8:—

COUNTY OF WEST SUSSEX.

Urban District of Horsham.

To the County Council of West Sussex;
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the County Council of West Sussex having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections prohibiting the driving of motor cars on a certain highway known and hereinafter referred to as Middle-street, and situate within the Urban District of Horsham, in the county of West Sussex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and such Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, after consideration of the said Report and of all the circumstances of the case, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of our powers in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car on the highway known as Middle-street at a speed exceeding five miles per hour.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the fourth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and five.

EWELL AND LONG GROVE RAILWAY.

Certificate of the Board of Trade for the Construction of a Railway from Ewell to Long Grove.

Whereas Robert Charles Foster, of Rugby, in the county of Warwick, and Sidney John Dicksee, of Rugby aforesaid, Contractors (hereinafter in this Certificate called "the Promoters," and which expression shall be deemed to include the survivor of the said Robert Charles Foster and Sidney John Dicksee and the executors and administrators of such survivor), have contracted with the London County Council for the erection of an asylum, to be known as the Long Grove Asylum (hereinafter referred to as "the Long Grove Contract"). And whereas it would be of public advantage that the Promoters should be authorized to construct a railway for the conveyance of goods and merchandise required for the purposes of or in connection with the aforesaid Long Grove contract, and thereby relieve the public roads in the district of the heavy traffic which would otherwise be carried over those roads in connection with the said contract:

And whereas the Promoters have contracted for the purchase of the lands required for the railway hereinafter described, and works in connection therewith, or for the necessary rights or easements over such lands.

And whereas the Promoters have entered into an agreement, dated the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and five, with the Epsom Urban District Council with reference to the use of the said railway, and a copy of that agreement has been deposited with the Board of Trade.

And whereas the Promoters have complied with the requirements of the Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864, and the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870.

And whereas after the date of the deposit of the plans in pursuance of the requirements of the Acts above recited, the Promoters applied to the Board of Trade for their consent to make certain alterations in such deposited plans and sections for the purpose of altering the lines and limits of deviation of the said railway in certain respects, which alterations were shown on certain amended deposited plans and sections which were deposited with the Board of Trade on the twenty-ninth March, one thousand nine hundred and five, and the Board of Trade have signified their consent to such alterations in the said deposited plans and sections.

Short Title

1. This certificate may be cited as "The Ewell and Long Grove Railway Certificate, 1905."

Power to Construct Railway.

2. Subject to the provisions of this certificate, the Promoters may on the lands contracted to be purchased by them as aforesaid, or over which they have acquired the necessary easements or rights of constructing the same, make and maintain the railway shown on the plans and sections deposited in respect of the application for this certificate as altered and amended in the lines and according to the levels shown on such plans and sections as altered and amended, with all proper stations, sidings, approaches, works, and conveniences connected therewith.

The railway authorized in the certificate will be situate wholly in the county of Surrey and commence in the parish of Ewell and rural district of Epsom, in the field numbered on the 25-inch Ordnance Map (second edition, 1895) 211, for the said parish, at a point adjoining the western fence of the London and South Western

Railway, thirty-two chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the southern fence of the orchard numbered on the said Ordnance Map 343 for the said parish of Ewell, and terminating in the parish of Epsom and urban district of Epsom in a field numbered on the said Ordnance Map 5 for the said parish at a point six chains or thereabouts measured in a north-easterly direction from the north-west corner of the said field and nine chains or thereabouts from the north-east corner of such field.

Gauge of Railway.

3. The railway shall be constructed on a gauge of four feet eight and a half inches.

Time for Completion.

4. If the railway is not completed within two years from the passing of this certificate, then on the expiration of that period the powers by this certificate granted to the Promoters for making and completing the same, or otherwise in relation thereto, shall cease to be exercised except as to so much thereof as is then completed.

As to User of Railway and Tolls.

5. The railway by this certificate authorized shall not be used for the purpose of passenger traffic, or for the conveyance of animals or carriages, but solely for the conveyance of goods and merchandise.

6. The railway shall not be worked or used across the public road known as Kingston-lane otherwise Hook-road, except between the hours of five and ten in the morning, nor at all on Sundays, Bank Holidays, Good Friday, or Christmas Day, or during the Epsom Spring or Summer Races, or on the day preceding or on the day following those races.

Crossing of Roads, &c.

7. The Promoters shall be at liberty to construct the railway across the following roads and public paths with a single line only on the level, and section 47 of the Railways Clauses Act, 1845, and section 6 of the Railways Clauses Act, 1863, shall not apply in the case of any such level crossing, viz. :—

Roads to be crossed on level.

Kingston-lane otherwise Hook-road;
Bridle path through the Horton Estate;
Footpath between the parishes of Ewell and Epsom;

and with respect to such level crossings the following provisions shall apply (that is to say):—

(a) The Promoters shall erect and maintain at all times gates across the railway on each side of the road;

(b) The Promoters shall employ a proper person to open and close such gates on either side of the level crossing;

(c) Such gates shall be kept constantly closed across the railway except during the time when engines, carriages, or trucks passing along the railway shall have occasion to cross the road, and shall be of such dimensions and so constructed as when closed across the railway to fence in the railway and prevent cattle or horses from entering upon the railway from the road;

(d) The person whose office or duty it may be to open or close the said gates shall cause the same to be closed as soon as any engines, carriages, or trucks passing along the railway shall have passed through the said gates.

8. The Company shall not open or use for traffic the said railway where it crosses the said roads except in accordance with such directions

as to the provision and employment of appliances and the precautions to be taken for securing the safety of the public as the Board of Trade may from time to time approve or prescribe. And the Board of Trade shall at all times have full power to cause the railway to be inspected for the purpose of ascertaining the sufficiency of such appliances and precautions.

As to Removal of Rails on Public Roads.

9. The powers conferred upon the Promoters by this Certificate to make and maintain level crossings of public roads shall unless otherwise agreed between the Promoters and the Epsom Urban District Council after the expiration of three years from the passing of this Certificate, cease to have effect, and the Promoters shall before the expiration of such period of three years, remove the rails and all other works and erections incidental to the said railway from such roads, and shall restore the said roads to the condition in which they were before the construction of the said level crossings.

As to Repairs to Public Roads.

10. Where in the exercise of the powers of this Certificate conferred the Promoters break up or otherwise interfere with any public road for the purpose of constructing the railway across the road on the level, the Promoters shall make good all damage done by them to the road and properly restore the road, and shall for a period of six months from the date of such restoration, properly maintain and repair the road so interfered with, and shall at all times whilst the railway shall cross the road on the level, properly maintain and repair so much of the road at any level crossing as lies between the rails of the railway and for a width of seven feet outside the rails on each side of the railway.

For the Protection of the Epsom Urban District Council.

11. For the protection of the Epsom Urban District Council (in this section called "the Council"), the following provisions shall unless otherwise agreed between the Council and the Promoters apply and have effect (that is to say):—

(1) The Promoters shall not in the exercise of the powers by this Certificate conferred upon them construct any works which shall or may interfere with or affect the surface of any road except in accordance with such plans, sections, and specifications as shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Council and any such works shall be constructed under the superintendence and to the reasonable satisfaction of the Surveyor of the Council.

(2) The Promoters shall so construct the works over the watercourse into which flows the outfall from the sewage farm of the Council as to prevent any interference with the free and uninterrupted flow of water in the said watercourse.

(3) The Promoters shall at all times, between the hours commencing one hour after sunset and terminating one hour before sunrise in each day, keep the level crossings of public roads, by this Certificate authorized, well and efficiently lighted to the reasonable satisfaction of the Council.

(4) If at the expiration of three years after the passing of this Certificate the Promoters have failed to remove the level crossings of public roads and to restore the said roads in accordance with the provisions of this Certificate, then the Council may at any time thereafter remove the said level crossings

and restore the said roads as aforesaid, and the Promoters shall upon demand repay to the Council the amount of their expenditure so incurred as certified by the Surveyor of the Council.

For the Protection of the Epsom Rural District Council.

12. The following provisions shall have effect for the protection of the Rural District Council of Epsom:—

- (1) The Promoters shall lay sleepers between the rail metals at the points where the railway crosses the bridle road from Kingston-lane, otherwise Hook-road, Epsom, to Chessington-road, Ewell, and the footpath leading from Gibraltar, Ewell, to the before-mentioned footpath. Such sleepers to be maintained at the same level as the metals of the rails;
- (2) In the event of the railway being fenced in, gates shall be provided at the level crossing of the above-mentioned bridle road and footpath;
- (3) In the event of the Rural District Council of Epsom so requiring, the Promoters shall provide a proper and effective screen by the side of the Chessington-road, where the proposed railway is constructed, at a less distance from such road than fifty yards, such screen to be of a height sufficient to screen off the railway from such road;
- (4) The Promoters shall not make any alterations of the present levels of the bridle road and the footpath above described;
- (5) The Kingston-lane level crossing gates shall be kept closed when railway traffic is not passing, and such gates shall be constructed so as to close across the line to prevent cattle straying.

Sections of Railway Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, not to apply to Railway.

13. Sections 68, 92, 94, 95, and 107 of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, shall not apply to the railway.

Agreements with London and South-Western Railway Company.

14. It shall be lawful for the Promoters to enter into agreements with the London and South-Western Railway Company for the purpose of working the railway.

Costs.

15. All costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the preparing for, obtaining and passing of this certificate or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Promoters.
