TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. REGULATIONS FOR THE DRAWING OF
EXCHEQUER BONDS TO BE ISSUED
UNDER THE FINANCE ACT, 1905 (5 Edw. 7,
cap. 4, sec. 7).

In pursuance of section 7 (2) of the Act 5 Edw. 7, cap. 4, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury make the following Regulations:—

1. The Bonds to be issued will be of the following numbers and denominations, vizt.:

2. The Bank of England will prepare 8,470 card discs printed with the cypher letters and numbers of the various Bonds, the several denominations being further distinguished by the use of discs differently coloured for each denomination.

3. On a day to be fixed by the Treasury, before the 31st December, 1905, the discs of each denomination shall be placed in a separate bag at the Bank of England in the presence of one of the Permanent Secretaries to the Treasury, or a person nominated by him, of the Comptroller-General of the National Debt, or a person nominated by him, and of the Governor or Deputy Governor of the Bank of England, or, failing both, a Director of the Bank who has served as Governor.

4. In the presence of the same persons the bags containing the discs shall be placed in a tin box secured by two locks of which the respective keys shall be held by the Secretary to the Treasury and the Governor of the Bank. The box shall be deposited at the Bank.

5. On a day prior to the 18th February in each year from 1906 to 1914 inclusive, in the presence of one of the Permanent Secretaries to the Treasury, or a person nominated by him, of the Comptroller-General of the National Debt, or a person nominated by him, and of the Governor or Deputy Governor of the Bank of England, or, failing both, a Director of the Bank who has served as Governor, the box shall be opened and there shall be drawn from the respective bags, without selection, 170 discs of denomination A, 50 of denomination B, 116 of denomination C, 410 of denomination D, and 101 of denomination E.

6. A list of the numbers in each denomination so drawn shall be signed by the aforementioned persons and delivered to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, who shall cause the list to be published in the London Gazette not later than the 18th February, with an intimation that the corresponding Exchequer Bonds will be paid off at par on the 18th April following, from which date interest thereon will cease, and that the Bonds, when presented for payment, must be accompanied by all coupons bearing date subsequent to the said date for repayment.
