The following Address was presented to The King by the Corporation of the City of Edinburgh on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to the City on the 18th September, 1905, to review the Scottish Volunteers:—

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Lord Provost, Magistrates and Council of the City of Edinburgh, beg humbly to offer to Your Majesty the assurance of our continued devotion to Your Person, Throne and Government.

We bid You welcome to Your ancient Scottish Capital and with Your devoted subjects throughout Scotland we respectfully make our humble acknowledgments of Your renewed interest in the welfare of this part of Your Majesty's dominions by Your present visit to the Metropolis.

Your Majesty's announcement of Your gracious intention to review the Scottish Volunteers has been received with great enthusiasm not only in this City but throughout the whole of Scotland. This special Royal favour conferred upon Your Scottish people and upon Your Majesty's Army at this time and Your deep interest in the Volunteer Forces, not only materially strengthen the bonds which unite loyal subjects to their Sovereign, but will give an impetus to all popular and patriotic movements designed to strengthen the defences of the country, and will foster the desire to maintain the highest state of efficiency in Your Majesty's Citizen Army. Your Majesty's presence will also encourage among Your people that spirit and valour which in days past were a distinguishing feature of their ancestors in their defence of King and Country.

We beg humbly to express our sincere gratitude for the great benefits conferred upon Your loyal subjects during Your Majesty's illustrious reign, and we pray that Your Majesty with Your Royal Consort Queen Alexandra may be long spared to rule in peace over Your devoted people.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Borough of Harrogate.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act of 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Kielsnor—New Light and Fog Signal Established.
Fakkebierg Light Discontinued.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 569 of 1904:—

The Danish Government has given further notice that, during the month of October, 1905, the light (white fixed) on Kielsnor will be discontinued, and a white group flashing light every twenty seconds, thus:—flash, one-third of a second; eclipse, four and two-thirds of a second; flash, one-third of a second; eclipse, fourteen and two-thirds of a second, will be exhibited, at an elevation of 125 feet above high water, from a white square tower, 107 feet in height, erected about  $2\frac{3}{4}$  cables N. 10° E. from the position of the present light.

The light is dioptric and of the 2nd order, and will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 17 miles.

On the same date Fakkebierg Light (fixed white), situated 9 cables to the north-westward of Kielsnor new light, will be discontinued, and the ice signals now shown near that lighthouse will be shown from a house immediately to the southward of Kielsnor new lighthouse.

The new light may be exhibited experimentally before it is permanently established.

A fog siren will be established at the new lighthouse and will give, during thick or foggy weather, a double blast once every minute, thus:
—blast, about two seconds; silent interval, about three seconds; blast, about two seconds; silent interval, about fifty-three seconds.
