- 1. The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 20, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.
- 2. The subjects of Examination will be as follows:—
 - Handwriting and Orthography, including Copying Manuscript.
 - 2. Arithmetic.
 - 3. English Composition.
 - Précis, including Indexing and Digest of Returns.
 - 5. Book Keeping and Shorthand Writing.
 - 6. Geography and Euglish History.
 - 7. Latin (translation from the language and composition)

 8. French (Ditto)

 Only two of these languages may be taken up.
 - 9. German (Ditto)
 - 10. Elementary Mathematics.
 - 11. Inorganic Chemistry, with Elements of Physics.
- N.B.—Not more than five of the subjects numbered 4 to 11 may be offered.
- 3. Examinations will be held at such times and places as the Commissioners may appoint.
- 4. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.
- 5. A fee of £3 will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.
