WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the second day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of North Meols, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of North Meols is a parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of North Meols which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas William Norris Heald, of Westbank, Southport, in the said county of Lancaster, Esquire, has contributed and transferred to us a sum of five thousand pounds Three pounds ten shillings per centum per annum Debenture Stock of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, towards the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, then of the said new parish, and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being.

"And whereas the said sum of five thousand pounds of stock has been so contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said William Norris Heald has nominated himself as the person to whom he desires that the first turn of the patronage of the said proposed district shall be assigned, and the Right Reverend Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, the Reverend Joseph Rogerson Edmond Cotter Hodgins, of Birkdale, in the said county of Lancaster, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool, the Reverend Gerard Heath Lander, of Saint Cyprian's Vicarage, number 61, Edge-lane, in the city of Liverpool, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool, William Lees, of Birkdale
