

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH JANUARY 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the parishes described in the First Schedule hereto shall cease to form part of the Area to which the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 was applied by the Order firstly described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall form part of the Area to which the said Order of 1903 was applied by the Order secondly described in such Schedule.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and six.
