

in the Bill to the waterworks and other works and things so proposed to be authorized.

17. To empower the Corporation to utilise their existing waterworks for other purposes than for domestic supply, or to abandon the same, or sell, lease, dispose of, or otherwise deal with, the same as may be defined by the Bill.

18. To authorize the Corporation to charge for water supplied to baths and waterclosets, and to provide that hotels, inns, and large public institutions shall be supplied by meter.

19. To empower the Corporation to raise money, by the issue of stock, or by mortgage or otherwise, for the construction of new waterworks, tramroad, road diversion, and alterations of existing waterworks, and for the other purposes of the Bill.

20. To empower the Corporation to charge the moneys borrowed for the purposes of the Bill, by mortgage or other means, on the Borough Fund and Borough Rate, and on the District Fund and General District Rate, and upon the property and revenue of their waterworks Undertaking, and the rates and revenues to arise under the Bill or other properties, funds, rates, and revenues of or under the control of the Corporation, or on any of the properties, funds, rates, and revenues aforesaid as they may determine.

21. To empower the Corporation to invest their sinking funds in the rates or other securities of any corporation, including those of the Corporation, and to include in all mortgages granted by the Corporation, as security for moneys borrowed by them, the corporate estate and all properties and undertakings and the rents and profits thereof.

22. To confirm or otherwise give effect to any agreements which may be made before the passing of the Bill touching any of the matters mentioned or contained in this Notice.

23. To empower the Corporation to extend the provisions of any existing bye-laws, to make new bye-laws, rules and regulations with reference to all or any of the matters referred to in this Notice, and to enforce the same by penalties or otherwise, or to vary or rescind the same, and to confer upon them all powers, rights, authorities and privileges which are or may become necessary for carrying the powers granted by the Bill into execution, to vary or extinguish all existing rights or privileges which would or might in any way prevent or interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

24. To incorporate, with alterations and amendments, and to apply, amend, alter, or repeal all or some of the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament following, or some of them (that is to say):—The Lands Clauses Acts; the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863; the Local Loans Acts, 1875; the Public Health Acts, and all Acts amending the said Acts respectively, or any of them.

25. To alter, amend, extend, enlarge, or repeal or re-enact with or without amendment, all or some of the provisions of the Shrewsbury Waterworks Act, 1856, and other Acts and Orders relating to the Corporation.

And notice is hereby also given, that plans and sections of the works intended to be authorized by the Bill showing the lines and levels thereof, and showing the lands intended to be taken compulsorily under the powers of the Bill, with a book of reference to such plans, and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, have been or will forthwith be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of

Salop at his office at Shrewsbury, and a copy of so much of the said plans and sections and book of reference as relates to each parish in or through which the intended works or any of them will be made to pass, or in which any lands, houses or other property intended to be taken are situate, together with a copy of this Notice, have been or will forthwith be deposited with the Clerk to the Rural District Council of Church Stretton, at his office at Shrewsbury, and with the Clerk to the Rural District Council of Clun, at his office at Bishop's Castle, and with the Clerk to each of the Parish Councils of All Stretton, Church Pulverbatch, Pontesbury, Condober, and Meole-Brace, at his residence, or if there be no Clerk to any Council, with the Chairman of that Council at his residence; and also with the Chairman of the parish meeting of Ratliughope and Smethcott respectively, at his residence.

Printed copies of the intended Act will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons if and as soon as leave may be given to introduce the Bill.

No. 81.—GULF OF BOTHNIA—SWEDEN.

Kåge Fiärd, and Husum—Shoals in Approach.

The Swedish Government has given notice, dated 10th January, 1906, of the existence of the undermentioned shoals in the Gulf of Bothnia off the coast of Sweden in the following positions:—

a. A shoal, with a depth of $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms over it, in the approach to Kåge Fiärd, situated approximately in lat. $64^{\circ} 49' 45''$ N., long. $21^{\circ} 14' 0''$ E.

b. A shoal, with a depth of $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms over it, in the approach to Husum, situated approximately in lat. $63^{\circ} 18' 30''$ N., long. $19^{\circ} 8' 50''$ E.

Quiriquina Island Light—Character Altered.

With reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 198 and 626 of 1905:—

The Chilean Government has given further notice, dated 20th November, 1905, that, on 1st December, the light on Quiriquina Island would be permanently altered to a white group
