

omnibus after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any motor omnibus shall on the request of the conductor quit the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene, profane, or offensive language whilst in or upon any motor omnibus, or commit any nuisance in, or upon, or against any motor omnibus, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

6. No person, not being a servant of the Council duly authorised in that behalf, shall touch, handle or interfere with any machine or appliance in, under, upon, or about any motor omnibus (except electric bells provided for the use of passengers).

7. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Council, the fare legally demandable for the journey, and in any case whether demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the motor omnibus.

8. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do, either show his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

9. Luggage of a form or description which in the opinion of the conductor is calculated to annoy or inconvenience any passenger shall not be taken in or upon any motor omnibus.

10. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Council employed in connection with a motor omnibus, shall travel on the steps of any motor omnibus, or stand either on the roof or platform, or in the interior of any motor omnibus, or sit on the outside rail on the roof or platform of any motor omnibus.

11. No person shall hold or hang on, by, or to any part of any motor omnibus, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

12. When any motor omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such motor omnibus after being warned by the conductor not to do so.

13. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any motor omnibus. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any motor omnibus in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the motor omnibus immediately upon request of the conductor.

14. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any motor omnibus with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

15. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any motor omnibus.

16. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings.

17. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position, inside of each motor omnibus in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

18. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of May, 1906.

THE STALYBRIDGE, HYDE, MOSSLEY AND
DUKINFIELD TRAMWAYS.

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Stalybridge, Hyde, Mossley and Dukinfield Tramways and Electricity Board (hereinafter called the Board) under the powers in that behalf conferred on them by section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. The Bye-Laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Board, and to all places with respect to which the Board have power to make Bye-Laws and Regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette inside a car, or on any compartment of a car not especially provided for that purpose.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the carriages, or remove or deface any number-plate, printed or other notice in or on the
