ALIENS ACT, 1905.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 20th instant, for the purposes of the Aliens Act, 1905, he made the following Rule under section 2 (2) of that Act:—

Whereas, in pursuance of the provisions of the Aliens Act, 1905, I made Rules dated the 19th December, 1905, and numbered 1 to 25:

Now I hereby make the following additional Rule, to be inserted after Rule No. 23:—

23A. Reasonable facilities (having regard to the accommodation available) shall be given for the attendance of Reporters to the public newspaper Press at any meeting of a Board at which an appeal is to be heard: provided that the Board shall be at liberty to deliberate in private before giving their decision in any case, and any Reporter present shall, if requested, withdraw in order that they may do so.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated March 12th, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, intimating that the following measures to be taken in Holland for the prevention of plague will remain in force for the year ending March 13th, 1907:—

The following are forbidden except by permission of the Minister for Home Affairs, and subject to the due observance of the directions which shall be given by him for the prevention of the spread of infection:—

1. The examination of persons and goods to detect the presence of infectious matter by means of experiments on animals.
2. The performance of autopsy of bodies of persons who have died from plague, or who are suspected to have been suffering from plague.
3. The removal of matter which is known or suspected to be infectious.

Burmah, 1885-7.

India Medal, with clasp, "Burmah, 1885-7," awarded to the Naval Brigades from the under-mentioned ships, engaged with the troops in the operations in Burmah, between 14th November, 1885, and 30th April, 1887:—

H.M. Ships Bacchante, Mariner, Ranger, Sphinx, Turquoise, and Woodlark.

Yonnie Expedition, 1887-8.

Ashantee Medal, with clasp, "1887-8," awarded to those members of the crews of H.M. Ships Acorn, Icarus, and Rifleman, who formed part of the Field Force engaged in the operations against the Yonnie Tribe, on the West Coast of Africa, between 13th November, 1887, and 2nd January, 1888.

Soudan, 1888.

Egypt Medal, with clasp, "Gemaizah, 1888," awarded to those who, on the 20th December, 1888, belonged to H.M. Ships Racer and Starling.
