The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination, commencing on the 26th June, 1906, will be held under the Regulations dated the 6th March, 1906, and published in the London Gazette of the same date, respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Junior Appointments in the Supply and Accounting Departments of the Admiralty, Junior Appointments in the Royal Ordnance Factories of the War Office, appointments as Second-class Assistant Accountant in the Army Accounts Department, and appointments as Examiner in the Exchequer and Audit Department.

Not fewer than eight situations will be filled on the result of this Examination, if so many candidates should be found to be duly qualified, viz.:—not fewer than three situations in the Army Accounts Department, and not fewer than five situations in the Exchequer and Audit Department.

As far as can at present be ascertained it is not probable that any situations in the Supply and Accounting Departments of the Admiralty, or in the Royal Ordnance Factories, will be offered for competition at this Examination.

No person will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 24th May, an application, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
