WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Nottingham) Order, 1906.

Dated 11th May, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the City of Nottingham, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (City of Nottingham) Order, 1906.

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the City of Nottingham to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Dipper, Kite, Nuthatch, Osprey, Robin, Great Gray Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Wren (all species).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City of Nottingham:—

Avocet, Bittern, Bullfinch, Bunting (all species), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Crossbill, Dipper, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Greenfinch, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, Common Linnet, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Redpole, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Siskin, Warbler (all species), Waxwing, Woodpecker (all species), Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH MAY 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903,

or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Portsmouth Borough Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.
