The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give
notice that, with the approval of the Lords Com-
missioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the under-
mentioned alteration will, after the 31st December,

1906, be made in the Regulations dated 6th
March, 1906, which were published in the London
Gazette of the same date, respecting Open Com-
petitive Examinations of candidates for registra-
tion as Boy Clerks for temporary employment in
Public Departments, viz.:—

For Clause 3, which is as follows:—

"3. The limits of age are 15 to 17.
Candidates must be of the prescribed age on
the first day of the Examination."

the following clause will be substituted, viz.:—

"3. The limits of age are 15 and 17. If
an examination begins in one of the first four
months of any year, candidates must be of
the prescribed age on the first day of
January in that year. If an examination
begins in one of the second four months of
any year, candidates must be of the pre-
scribed age on the first day of May in that
year. If an examination begins in one of
the last four months of any year, candidates
must be of the prescribed age on the first
day of September in that year."

candidates must be of the prescribed age on
the first day of September in that year."
