

and with the consent of the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Botley, shall be transferred from the said Emily Mary Lee, Frederick Lee, James Palmer Nash, and Ellen Annie Lee to the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same bishoprick, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish of

Great Canford and partly out of the district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, both in the county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Great Canford and the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Great Canford and of the said district parish of Saint Mary, Longfleet, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship but there is an unconsecrated building known as the Church of Saint John the Baptist situate at Broadstone within the limits of the said proposed district.

"And whereas Edith Sophia Harriet Dawson Damer deceased (who died on the twenty-fourth day of January in the year one thousand nine hundred and five) the widow of the late Reverend Lionel Dawson Damer, Clerk in Holy Orders, formerly vicar of the said parish of Great Canford, did by her will dated the fourteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and proved on the twenty-seventh day of February in the year one thousand nine hundred and five bequeath to the Right Honourable Philip Henry Wodehouse, Baron Currie, Laurence Currie, Esquire, and Denis Marshall, Esquire, the executors and trustees named in her said will, a sum of ten thousand pounds to be applied by them as they shall in their absolute and uncontrolled discretion think fit for or towards the endowment of the said building known as the church of Saint John the Baptist situate as aforesaid when a separate ecclesiastical district shall have been assigned thereto.

"And whereas the said building known as the church of Saint John the Baptist, situate as aforesaid, has been duly conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it is our intention that such building when duly consecrated shall become the church of the separate district which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we are satisfied that by virtue of the said bequest an adequate and permanent maintenance will be available for the support of the minister of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish then for the support of the incumbent thereof.

"And whereas the said maintenance for the support of the minister of the said proposed district will be provided as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish, and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said executors and trustees named in the said will have nominated the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole
